REPORT OF 1918 IMPERIAL COUNCIL SESSION

To the Officers and Nobles of Tripoli Temple:

The forty-fourth annual session of the Imperial Council found all of your representatives present at Atlantic City on the fourth day of June, 1918. The Council convened in the steel pier auditorium across the board walk from the summer resort extortioners, so that the delegates were, as one speaker at the opening session put it, "between the devil and the deep sea."

Crescent Temple, of Trenton, Salaam Temple, of Newark, and Lulu Temple, of Philadelphia, combined forces and acted as hosts, so that those in attendance were not without many pleasant courtesies extended to make their stay agreeable. Lulu Temple band, patrol and chanters were in attendance two of the days and assisted in giving a Shrine atmosphere to the occasion.

Imperial Potentate Ovenshire, who is too well known to Tripoli to need commendation at our hands, gave his address reviewing the year's work. In it he evidenced the high ideals for which he has worked during his term. All the time he has labored incessantly to raise the standard of the Order, and has sought to curb the tendency of certain Temples to descend to vulgarity and indecency in their ceremonials. He also stood up straight for a ceremonial without the accompaniment of inebriating beverages.

In his sum-up of the war contributions of the various Temples during the year, up to May 1, he gave the following:

Liberty loan bonds purchased....	\$754,000
Red Cross	110,453
Y. M. C. A.....	14,498
Other war activities.....	39,661

The number of Nobles in the service is 11,649 and the number of men in the service initiated since enlistment is 2,792.

The total membership on January 1 was 259,113, a net gain of 20,120.

The cash balance on hand at the beginning of the term was \$139,187.77 and the cash balance at the end of the term was \$135,728. While this shows a net loss it must be remembered that out of last year's balance there was given \$20,000 to the Red Cross by the Imperial Council, so that counting this benefaction there was a substantial gain in the financial condition.

The interesting legislation included the following:

An attempt was made to raise the minimum initiation fee to \$75, but this was defeated. A special fee of \$25 was fixed, at the option of the Temple conferring the Order, for men in the military or navel service.

Stated Meeting - June 13, 2018

Meeting opened in due form at 7:00 PM by Ill Sir Keith Sargeant. All seats properly filled. Nobles Kevin Smith and William Caitlin crossed the Cold Sands aided by Ill. Sir Doug Winter P.P. P.P.s, Unit Heads, Shrine Club Presidents, and Emeritus members were introduced.

Minutes- Minutes were published in the *Tattler*. A motion was made and seconded to suspend the reading of the minutes. A vote was called and the motion passed.

Petitions- petitions were read from Cain Allen Finger and Matthew A. Yardley. A vote was called for and a ballot spread among the nobles.

Financial Report. Ill. Sir Doug Winter P.P., filling in for Treasurer John Bugajski, gave the financial report. Income sup. We have received money from mr. Michael Geiger as part of his restitution. Scimitar- A shrine edition Henry rifle will be raffled off in September. A limited number of tickets will be sold for \$100.00 each. Nobles Al Soriano and Pat Jackson gave a report on the Locust Street Festival. They thanked everyone who helped out. They presented a check for \$4000.00 from the festival and said plans are being made for next year. A thank you letter will be sent. Noble Jackson gave a report enlist years gun raffle commissions. Scimitar will sponsor hors d'oeuvres for September Stated Meeting Steak Night. Planning is under way for next years Sportsmen Night which will be on March 22nd, 2019. Ill. Sir Keith gave more information on the Locust Street Festival.

Old Business- None.

New Business- Election of a new trustee to replace Fritz Jorgenson was called for. Noble Jeff Delaney was nominated by Gerry Arnholt

and seconded by Doug Winter. Noble Delaney accepted the nomination. There were no more nominations made. A motion was made by Noble David Haas to close the ballot. A motion was made by Fritz Jorgenson to cast a unanimous ballot. Motion was seconded. A vote was called and the motion passed. Noble Delaney was duly installed.

Emeritus Status- Emeritus requests were made for Nobles Chuck Dadian and Blair Dixon for their work on the Circus Committee and for Noble Joe Schoner for the Trustees. The requests were approved by the Board.

A certificate from Central City Charity, (Our Savior Lutheran Church) was read. Noble Bob Sanders gave a report on the Golf Outing and Hospital day at the Chicago shrine Hospital. Flyers were handed out for the Chinooks baseball game on Sunday, July 22nd, 2018. Ill. Sir Keith gave a report on the Casino Trip. He explained why the back gate of our parking lot was closed. We will be working to improve our web site. Web Fez will be offering an on-line dues payment feature in the near future. We will also look into n-line dues payment attached to our web site. We are working to up-grade our phone system.

Black Camel- We were notified today that Noble Fred Hencke had passed away. We will officially honor him at the September Stated meeting. His funeral will be Wednesday, June 20, 2018 from 1-3 at Krause funeral home 9000 W. Capitol Dr.

Sick and Distressed- The list was given. Noble Bob Capen thanked everyone for thinking of him during his recuperation.

Mystic Brewers unit held their first meeting. The next meeting will be June 28th, 2018 at 6:00 PM. The Festival of Trees committee will meet tomorrow June 14th at 6:00 PM.

Hospital 50/50 Raffle- \$490.00 was collected. A winner was drawn. Noble Harry Burczyk was the lucky winner and received \$245.00

An update was given on the Lorenz painting which was sent off to auction. The painting did not achieve the minimum bid and will be returned to us. There being no more business the Temple was closed in due form.
