Biblically, darkness is used to describe evil, despair, sin or separation from God. Petitions: Petitions were read for William Catlin, Paul Branovan, Kevin Smith, Patrick Delaney and Dennis Delaney. Ballot was called for and meeting continued.

Financial Report: John Bugjaski gave the report. He asked that money for the Vidalia Onions be turned in ASAP as bill must be paid. He proceeded to explain the high points of the statement. For the first time our tax reports will be audit by our CPA to insure that they are in the correct form. All our audits are up to date except for 2017 which is still being worked on. Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion passed.

Ballot: Ballot on petitions was returned clear and petitioners pleas were granted.

Black Camel: Walter Booth and Russ Provencher were called by the Black Camel. A prayer was offered.

Sick List: Chaplain Ron Hack gave the report on the sick list.

Finance Committee: No report.

Trustees: 50 defective steam traps were found and repaired.

Banquet and Catering: Ill. Sir Doug Winter informed that B&C is doing well and events are starting to pick up.

Scimitar: A Henry, Shrine commemorative, 22 cal. rifle will be raffled off. Only 25 tickets will be sold for \$100.00 each. Locust Street Festival in June needs volunteers. Workers needed from morning until 10:00 PM. Cleanup and assisting with run. Donation will be made to Scimitar and could be quite lucrative for Tripoli. Sportsman Night will be held on March 22, 2019.

Red Fez: There will be a Brewers outing May 29th. Our web site www.tripolishrine.com will have parade schedules from the units. John Bugjaski give info on our 2 websites www.tripolishrine.com for members and www.tripolishrinecenter.co for info on public use of the building for events and events held in the building.

Old Business: Tom Schlicht gave a report on the Vidalia Onions. He thanked everyone for there help. There are still a few bags of onions in the garage. Ill. Sir Keith read a restitution notice from the court regarding Michael Geiger. Trustee Fritz Jorgenson is stepping down. An election for a temporary trustee will be held at the June meeting.

Dues structure was discussed. A motion was made by John Bugjaski seconded by Frank Foti to have a dues structure of \$135.00 for any candidates crossing the sands between January 1st and June 30th. Broken down to \$90.00 dues, \$30.00 Hospital per capita, \$5.00 Hospital fee and \$10.00 *Tattler*. Anyone crossing the sands from July 1st to December 31st will be charged \$30.00 Hospital per capita, \$5.00 Hospital fee and \$10.00 *Tattler*. Initiation fee will still be \$315.00 borked down to \$145.00 for new Fez, \$80.00 banquet and \$90.00 Tripoli. If a candidate receives a Fez from someone or would like to purchase a pre-owned Fez price will be adjusted accordingly.

Bob Lijewski gave us info on the region of Honor. The Legion of Honor convention will be held in Milwaukee in 2019. Ill. Sir Keith informed everyone that Noble Bob will be installed as Commander of the Great Lakes Shrine Association this year.

Noble Marv Laack alias "Toothy" brought a birthday card for Lucille Ott, wife of John Ott, who celebrated her 102nd birthday recently. Everyone in attendance signed it.
