Potentate's Message

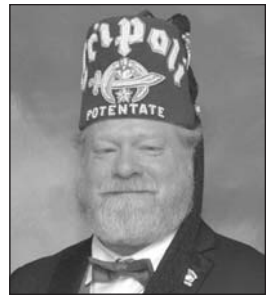
Greetings Nobles,

Monarch Butterflies

Nobles,

This summer, my wife raised and released Monarch butterflies. The transformation of the tiny egg, to a tiny caterpillar that quickly becomes a large caterpillar that then turns into a bright green chrysalis with gold specks and finally emerges as an adult Monarch butterfly is amazing to watch. Many of you have heard about the migration of these beautiful creatures to the forests of Mexico; but did you know that none of these migrating Monarch butterflies have been to Mexico? These migrating Monarchs are the great-great-grandchildren of the Monarchs that flew back from Mexico last Spring.

When the time is right, usually starting in mid-September, the Monarchs begin their long southbound journey, stopping to sip nectar for energy and gathering in roosts (large groups of butterflies) in the trees for protection at night or from bad weather. The next day, if the weather is good for flying, they are gone. They leave a place where they have food and shelter, not knowing what lays ahead on their journey of thousands of miles across land and the ocean to finally arrive in Mexico. Will they find be able to find flowers with life sustaining nectar and safe areas to roost? They may have to fly through storms or the weather may turn cold too early (can't fly if too cold). They may crash into a windshield, or be captured in a child's net and never make it to Mexico. But yet, these delicate looking creatures leave the known for the unknown with the belief that they will complete their long migration to Mexico and return again next Spring. Now I don't know if butterflies worry about the future like we do, but leaving the known for the unknown takes faith. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount tells his followers, "Therefore, I say to you, do not worry about your life

...Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" [Matthew 6:25-34] (NKJV) Worrying about all the unknowns in your life will not change anything, but it will steal excitement and happiness out of the present. It may prevent you from doing things that you really want to do or embracing new opportunities that come your way. Have faith that God will provide for you, support you in new opportunities and help you weather the inevitable storms in your life. If a fragile Monarch butterfly can make a journey of thousands of miles to Mexico and back, surely we can have faith that God will provide for each of us.

New Charity coming to Wisconsin - Traveling Stone Soup

In order it is trying to increase the positive impact that Masonry has on the community and a charity to the state to help benefit the hungry and Feeding America. McKinley Lodge #307 is trying to start a new tradition. This charity is based on the story of the Stone Soup, where a stranger comes to town with a pot of water and some stones, and persuades the whole community to come together with the various ingredients to produce a tasty soup for the whole community. Traveling Stone Soup attempts to do the same, but in a way where not only are the stomachs of those that attend get filled, but the stomachs and souls of those in need in the area are filled as well. There will be enough fresh, hot home-cooked soup for over 1,000 people.

Traveling Stone Soup is being brought to Wisconsin from Michigan and Arizona by Michigan Mason, Bro. Jim Crosby (Peppermint Jim), and McKinley's own brother, Bro. Nick Niklosovich (Chef Nick). The goal for the organization is to feed 1 million people, and so far the organization is a quarter of the way there. McKinley Lodge hopes that this will become a statewide event that can get the support of all Masonic Organizations.

There are several things that McKinley is seeking, which can be provided by Masons and the general public: First, is publicity - for this event to be successful, we need to get the word out to the community. Second is soup ingredients - we are willing to take whatever pasta, vegetables and meat ingredients people are willing to provide in order to put together soups. For example, if someone donates 20 pounds of chicken, and someone donates

20 pounds of beef, two soups will be made, one of each kind. Third, we are looking for monetary donations before the event - it is always expected that some ingredients will need to be purchased, as well as propane. And fourth is people to attend the day of the event - we need guests to sell the soup on the day of, as well as to provide non-perishable donations. Please consider offering up help in one of these ways.

Let's develop this into another one of those charity events that Masons can proudly discuss when asked "What does Freemasonry actually do for the local community?"

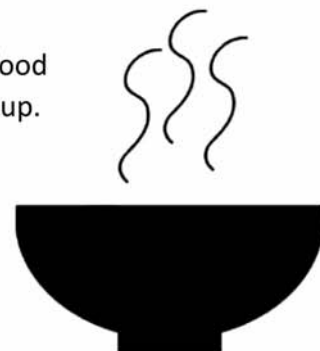

Stated Meeting - Sept. 12, 2018

The meeting was opened in due form at 7:00PM by Ill. Sir Keith Sargeant. All seats properly filled.

Cold Sands: Nobles Cain Finger, Dennis Delaney, and Patrick Delaney crossed the Cold Sands aided by Noble Matthew Wright.

P.Ps, Visiting Nobles, Unit Heads, Shrine Club Presidents, and Emeritus members were introduced.

Minutes: As the minutes were published in the *Tattler*, a motion was made and seconded to suspend the readings of the minutes. A vote was called and the motion passed.

Petitions: Petitions were read from Jeff Froderman, Michael G. Smith, Gary Sorensen, David Branovan, and Michael Peden. A vote was called for and a ballot was spread among the nobles. The business meeting continued during the vote. Immediately following completion of the vote, the ballot was reviewed and reported clear and petitioners' pleas were granted.

Suspensions: Mitchell Schuttke was notified as outlined in the Shrine bylaws for nonpayment of dues. A motion was made and a vote taken. It passed by a majority of the members present and he was suspended for nonpayment of dues.

Demits/Re-instatements: None

Financial Report: John Bugajski gave the report. He proceeded to explain the high points of the statement. We are continuing to review all expenses in an effort to cut down expenses. Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion passed.

Trustees: Trustees are initializing contracts for repair of the roof.

Scimitar: A Henry, Shrine commemorative 22 cal. rifle will be raffled off. Only 25 tickets will be sold for \$100.00 each. Planning is underway for next year's Sportsmen's Night schedule for March 22, 2019. The Golf Outing is set for June 24, 2019 and will benefit the Shrine Hospitals.

Finance Committee: PP Doug Winter commented on the suspension of membership and thank Recorder Frank Foti for his work on contacting members before we take any action on a member. He also reported that the Board of Directors continues to look at our artwork and have sold 4 pieces for a net profit of \$38,571.06. They continue to work very hard at keeping all our expenses down. The FC needs to have the driver information on all vehicles that are kept in the garage for insurance purposes. Please contact the office and John Bugajski with the information asap.

Black Camel: Nobles Fred Hencke, Richard M Turtenwald, Leland Hermann, Richard Kolo, Richard H Hackbarth, John Richard "Doc" Lemberger, Glen Jante, and James Kleck were summoned by the black camel. A special ceremony, with the lighting of 3 candles, was presented in remembrance of September 11, 2001. A prayer was offered by Chaplain Ron Hack.

Sickness and Distressed: Chaplain Ron Hacked gave the report and asked for everyone's help in maintain the list.

Doors Open: Noble Bruce Nelsen encourages all Nobles, Units, and Clubs to help with Open Doors Milwaukee scheduled for September 22 and 23. Help is need between 9AM and 5PM on both days.

Red Fez: No report

Hospital Report: Noble Bob Manders reported that with the Packer's Shrine Game donation from this year's game, the Green Bay Packers have donated over \$4Million to the Shrine Hospitals.

Matt Wright reported on the Minneapolis Hospital and the plans to downsize to a clinch status. They will continue to see and receive patients as they do now and continue to work with other hospitals in the area.

Ill Sir Sargeant report that there will be 4 hospitals downsizing like Minneapolis based on a vote of the membership at this year's Imperial Session. There are no plans to close any hospitals. This is only a way to improve operating margins while still offering first class care to the patients.

Festival of Trees: Chief Rabban Bob Capen report on the Second Annual Festival of Trees scheduled for Nov. 17 – 24. There is an active signup sheet for volunteers; please sign up as your help is need to make this another successful year. Still looking for tree sponsors. The next volunteers meeting is set for Oct 9, please plan on attending.

Upcoming: Ill Sir Sargeant reported that numerous events are coming up including the All Faiths Night 10/24, Ladies Fall Fundraiser 10/27, Ceremonial and Potentate's Ball 11/10. See the *Tattler* for details.

NOVEMBER MEETING: The Ill Sir Keith Sargeant announced the November meeting will be changed from Wednesday, November 14 to Monday, November 12. This is due to the Shrine Center being in the process of being changed to a Winter Wonderland for the Festival of Trees.

Presentations: The family of Noble Richard Kolo, a 62 year member, presented a check to the Shriners Hospital for Children – Chicago for the amount of \$20,000 in his memory.

There being no more business the meeting was closed in due form.

Bio: John Bennethum



My name is John Bennethum and I was born on April 20, 1941 in West Allis. I graduated in 1958 from W.A. Central High School. I earned 3 Degrees from UW Milwaukee/Madison and worked for MPS from 1964-1996. I was a Biology teacher and Science teacher at Hamilton High School.

From 1956-1992, I was involved with DeMolay and was the Director of Education, Chevalier, active Legion of Honor, and State Staff. I joined West Allis Lodge #291 in 1965. Each year I joined a New York Rite body and then Scottish Rite until joining the Shrine in 1972. I was Appointed Chaplain in 1999 by Past Potentate Ron Hurst and served from January 1999 until I fell and broke my right shoulder on 12/10/2017. I served 50+ years to most of the Masonic Organizations.

Meet Michelle

Michelle's young life got off to a difficult start. Born with a brain hemorrhage at birth on June 12, 1990, Michelle had a shunt put in when she was just 10 days old. Her hips and knees were caved in, and she was soon diagnosed with cerebral palsy (CP): a condition that affects muscles, movement, and motor skills.

"Doctors told my mom that I would have difficult doing basic things and would likely have a very hard life," said Michelle.

Michelle's mother worked with her to walk, crawl, and move around in their home in the suburbs of Detroit, Michigan. Her grandmother introduced her to roller skating when she was just five years old, and would take her skating daily. Michelle had some difficulty skating because of her CP but she powered through because she loved it so much.

As Michelle grew, her mother heard from a family friend about Shriners Hospitals for Children in Chicago, where they specialized in orthopaedic and muscle conditions. They connected with their local Shriners fraternity in Southfield, Michigan, to arrange for transportation to the Chicago Shriners Hospital. They first visited SHC in 2001 when Michelle was 11, and saw Dr. John Lubicky, an orthopaedic surgeon and hospital Chief of Staff at the time. Michelle was seen in the hospital's motion analysis lab and based on her gait, Dr. Lubicky determined surgery would help correct her lower extremities and assist with walking.

"When I first found out that I needed surgery, I was terrified. But Shriners felt like a different type of hospital – everyone was so friendly and helpful," said Michelle, "The OR nurse assured me that everything would be okay."

Michelle had surgery on her hips, knees, and feet. Her legs were in a cast for about a month followed by six months of intense physical therapy.

"My knees used to cave in to the point where they were touching each other, and after surgery I was walking almost like a normal person," said Michelle.

Michelle began skating again six months after her surgery. She quickly noticed her legs were straighter and it was easier to skate. When Michelle was 12 she started taking skating lessons and won a Spirit of the Heart award, which goes to a skater who has a physical disability who doesn't let anything hold them back. She skated in her first regionals event in the Midwest in 2014 - called the Great Lakes Regional Skating Competition - and in 2017 went to her first national skating competition – the USA Roller Figure Skating National Championship. She skated in nationals again in 2018 and hopes to go in 2019.

"I'm thankful to my family for introducing me to skating and showing me that my condition shouldn't hold me back, and to Shriners Hospital for giving me the same message. We're all capable to doing great things, we just need to go out there and do them," said Michelle.

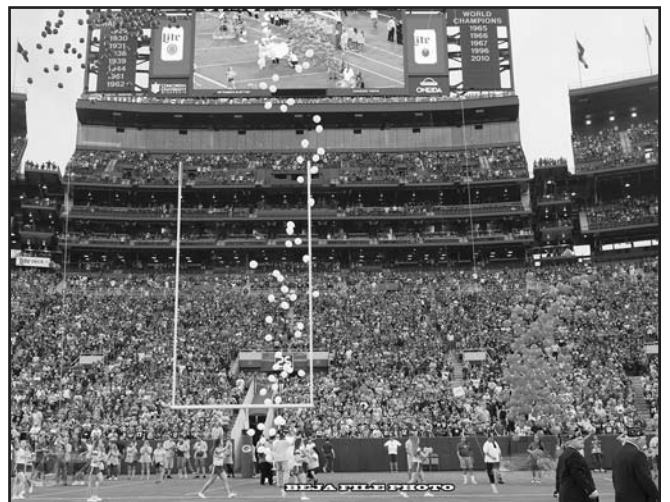

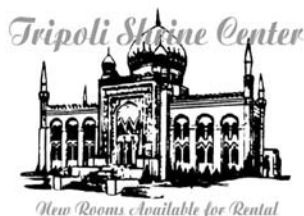
