
Potentate's Message

As Easter approaches, we hear the story of how Peter denied knowing Jesus after Jesus was taken away from the Garden of Gethsemane for trial [Matthew 26:31-75; Mark 14: 29-72; Luke 22:33-66; John 18:15-27]. Peter was confident that he would not deny Jesus, but when later asked if he was with Jesus, he quickly denied being a follower of Jesus. Why? Very likely he, being human, was afraid that he too would be arrested.

I believe Peter acted as many of us would act. Have you ever denied knowing someone or being part of a group? I believe most of us would have to answer "yes." Why would we pretend we don't know someone or deny our membership in a group? Like Peter, we are often afraid of what others think of us and what they might do. We fear being ridiculed, confronted, or shunned by family, friends or people in positions of power and how they will treat us.

Our Illustrious Sir Bob Capen, in his comments to various Tripoli Units and Clubs, asks our Shrine members to proudly wear their fezzes when attending Shrine events. We have much to be proud of as Shriners and wearing our fezzes helps others see the good works that we do. But like Peter, we may not want to call attention to our membership in the Shrine for fear of ridicule or confrontation. Prospective members may have these same concerns that keep them from joining the Shrine.

Peter's denial of Jesus brings him back to the Lord and strengthens his Faith. He goes on to strengthen other believers and establish Jesus' Church. We too can use this story to strengthen our connection to the Shrine and to move past our fears to make others aware of the good works done by Shriners in our Communities and especially the medical care for children. Pride in our Shrine membership and wearing of our fezzes may encourage others to take the next step in their Masonic journey and become a Shriner. It may encourage our family members or friends to become Masons.
