A vote was called and motion passed. Budget was approved.

Trustee's Report: Noble Mark Pachefsky reported that we need more volunteers to help out. There was nothing major to report on.

Greetings,

If you're not familiar with DeMolay, it is an International organization open to boys between the ages of 12-21 and is run by the members with certified adult advisors providing assistance and oversight. Where the schools teach our sons to be scholars, and after school sports teach them to be athletes, I like to think that Demolay helps young boys learn to be good young men, much like our Blue Lodges help good men be better. Demolay promotes responsibility and leadership in our members along with a good dose of fun and friendship ( https://demolay.org and www.widemolay.org/). We meet at the West Allis Masonic Center on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of every month at 7:00 PM. DeMolay counts many famous people among its alumni, including some names you may recognize - Colonel Frank Borman (Commander of Apollo 8, the first mission to fly around the Moon), John Wayne, Walt Disney, Mel Blanc, John Steinbeck, Walter Cronkite, Neil Armstrong, Fran Tarkenton, Alice Cooper, Mark W. While I was thinking of the many critical topics that could have been discussed, it occurred to me that perhapsthe Nobility, Units and Clubs would also benefit from these topics as well.

The first topic of discussion would have been communication. The act of transferring information to one another seems to be too much of burden for us. The reason I say this is due to an astute observation that was brought to my attention from the young wife of a Noble. After explaining that her and her husband cannot and do not attend many events, she further explained that she noticed that people who are perceived as "active" are interacted with more, or to be more specific, it occurred to her that those who are more active are more embraced by the Nobility; while on the other hand, those who are perceived as "not active enough" are practically shunned. For some of you, "shunned" may seem a little dramatic; but for others who have joined our beautiful fraternity, unfortunately "shunned" may seem very appropriate. Discussing this observation with some of our "Sage Generation", they offered these rebuttals, "What she observed is true, because you 'reap what you sow'." Another stated, "It's like I've always said, 'the more you put into this fraternity, the more you get out of it'." Another was so bold as to say, "That's right! If you're not active, what's the point of being a member?" It was with these thoughts in mind that I would have recommended to our new leadership – and it is why I now recommend this to ALL of the Nobility – to please keep in mind the differences between us. None of us has the same amount of time, money or passion for the fraternity as the next Noble and therefore none of us should be judged by what we can or cannot give. And who decided the appropriate amount anyway? Perhaps if we appreciated any amount of resource (time, dedication, hard work, money, etc) that a Noble and his family can give, many more resources would

be happily given? Recruiting new Nobles is important, but Retaining our Nobles is just as, if not more, important. Most people have a natural feeling of wanting to belong, and ironically, this is the main topic we preach to new Nobles when they join, "You should become a member of (which is the very definition of belong) "this" Unit or "that" Club." It seems completely contradictory that once they have joined, we seem to reject them simply because it is someone's opinion, they are not active enough. Reiterating some advice given a few months back: Units and Clubs should embrace a potential member from the beginning, mentor him through his travels, encourage his continued commitment and relish every moment given. The Kenosha Shrine Club knows what I'm talking about.

While thinking about the observation that was brought to my attention and the upcoming change in leadership, I realized this time of change may be a perfect opportunity for all of us to think about something we can change in ourselves. Simple things, such as our greetings to each other, talking about positive things in your life instead of always complaining, lending a hand, making a call, etc. This world is constantly full of negativity, so no one will want to pay to attend, travel to or visit a place where they'll receive more negativity. I know it's been said hundreds of times before, ALL of us are responsible for membership!!! The dynamics of our organization, along with the tremendous acts of recruitment, retention and reinstatement are dependent upon ALL OF US and they are all key to our potential growth. They weren't just my responsibilities and they will not be just Al and his team's responsibility. If we all do not work together, share ideas and proven techniques, and communicate our mistakes and successes; then year-afteryear we cannot complain about the size of the Ceremonial class. Like the old sage said, "We all reap what we sow."

It was an honor to serve Tripoli and I personally want to thank Nobles Joe Brunk and Don Adams for all their help. Again, nothing but well wishes to Illustrious Sir Al and his crew.


