


I hope you were able to start 2019 surrounded by family, friends and surrounded with joy, peace, kindness and love. Best wishes for a happy and healthy 2019!



Explanation of the forms needed to complete club and unit financial information was explained. Noble Bob Capen questioned some of the entrees in the report on the Balance Sheet. John explained them. A motion to accept the report was made and seconded. Vote wa called and motion passed. Report was accepted.

Imperial Sir Jim Smith: Imperial Assistant Rabban was introduced and escorted to the Altar. Ill. Sir Keith conducted him to the stage and presented him the gavel. Imperial Sir Jim gave some opening remarks and returned the gavel.

Black Camel: Nobles Myron A. Polzin, Todd E. Edwards, Anthony G. Dake, John Toomey and Allan Rauch have been called by the Black Camel since the last meeting. A prayer was offered for them by Chaplain RonHack.

Sick and Distressed: Report was given by ChaplainHack. He asked for information on anyone needing to be on

or taken off the list.

Finance Committee Report: P.P. Doug Winter gave the finance report. He gave further explanation to Noble Capen's question. He gave the high points printed in the report. It is looking like we will end the year about \$40,000 in the plus.

The Milwaukee Health Dept. came in for the inspection last Friday. The kitchen received an A grade. Something to be proud of.

Noble Doug brought up how well everyone in the temple is co-operating. 2018 has been very positive.

The 2019 budget proposal was distributed by Ill. Sir Doug for everyone to read along with some discussion of the numbers. We will go over it next month in detail and vote on it after.

Doug gave some thoughts on the loss of some of the key members of the Temple. He stressed that we need every noble to help us make the budget work.

P.P. Pete Salza is recuperating from hip surgery and looking forward to getting back to helping out.

<u>**Trustees:**</u> Report was given. HVAC is at top of the list. The equipment is 40+ years old and will need be replaced in the near future, The new electronic sign out front is up and running. The bulbs in the ballroom have been replaced with 8 energy efficient LED bulbs.

Scimitar: Nobles Gerry Arnholt and Dave Bevsek gave the report. Sportsman night will be March 22nd. We need volunteers to make it successful. A Volunteer meeting will be held in February. Also any donations we can get will really help. Finally we need to sell tables.

<u>Red Fez:</u> Noble Pat Jackson thanked everyone who participated in the Children's Christmas party.

Hospital: Noble Bob Manders gave a report on a family who was aided by the Shrine Hospital. He told us how grateful the family was and that they can't believe how everyone with the same problem they had won't take advantage of the Hospital.

Festival of Trees: Report by Chief Rabban Bob Capen. He thanked everyone who helped set up and run the event especially the wife. Our attendance was down somewhat but having raised the prices a little our revenue was up. The gross was \$66,580.00 with a net of \$40,000.00. \$36,000.00 was donated to the Temple. The winners of the trees are on the new website, tripolishrine.org along with more info on the Shrine, it's units and functions. He announced that will soon be able to pay our dues on the site. At present we are only able to pay them online by signing in to Webfez. It has been pointed out that we are in need of a Technical Director to take advantage of the opportunities we can offer. Noble Sean Schult has offered to step up to fill the position. Money has been included in the budget to get started.

Old Business: The Divan has participated in many installations. The Kenosha shrine club donated \$32,000.00 to the hospital and transportation fund. Winnebago shrine club donated \$1000.00 to the Temple. Make sure to let the office know about any upcoming Installations so the Divan can make arrangements to attend.

<u>Circus</u>: This year the circus will be held February 22, 23 and 24th. This year we will sell the programs. We are thinking of getting sponsors to defray the cost of the Hospitality room. The radios used for the Circus have been misplaced. If anyone has information on them please contact the office.

Salvation Army Bell Ringing: Waukesha S.C. manned 10 spots this year. The Temple had 3 units at 2 Locations. There are no results yet.

Asst. Rabban: High Priest and Prophet Joe Brunk was nominated and seconded. There were no other nominations and a motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot. The motion passed. Noble Brunk accepted the position.

<u>High Priest and Prophet:</u> Oriental Guide Matt Wright was nominated and seconded. There were no other nominations and a motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot. The motion passed. Noble Wright accepted the position.

Oriental Guide: Noble Glen Jones was nominated and seconded. There were no other nominations and a motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot. The motion passed. Noble Jones accepted the position.

<u>**Treasurer:**</u> Treasurer John Bugajski was nominated and seconded. There were no other nominations and a motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot. The motion passed. Noble Bugajski accepted the position. He informed the Nobility that this will be his last year.

Recorder: Recorder Frank Foti was nominated and seconded. There were no other nominations and a motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot. The motion passed. Noble Foti accepted the position.

Finance (2): P.P. Pete Salza and Noble Gerry Arnholt were nominated and seconded to fill a three yr. term. There were no other nominations and a motion was made to cast a unanimous ballot. Motion passed. The Nobles accepted.

Trustee (1): Nobles Joe Schoner and Mark Pachefsky were nominated and seconded. A ballot was spread and returned. Results were Joe Schoner 33 and Mark Pachefsky 38. Noble Pachefsky was declared the winner. He accepted the position.

The Potentate thanked the committee and they were dismissed.

Imperial Sir Jim was presented with a custom Cheese Fez emblazoned with three stars and a "Hand Made" custom wood Fez case. He was extremely impressed and thanked everyone.






