Faith & Hope



On Saturday February 2, over 85 patients and volunteers from Shriners Hospitals for Children – Twin Cities enthusiastically celebrated a Minnesota "heat wave" (which meant temps almost reached the 30s!) and joined us at Afton Alps for Winter Camp Achieve.

Families traveled from South Dakota, North Dakota, Iowa and Wisconsin for the wonderful opportunity of having their child/children participate with other kids who have similar challenges in all sorts of amazing activities; and best of all, we welcomed 14 new campers this year! The ski lodge was quiet when the volunteers arrived for orientation session, but the quiet didn't last long, because once the kids arrived (picture #1) the room was filled with lots of noise, clomping boots, a few nerves and a TON of excitement!

While getting ready to pair up the kids with their volunteers, three of the sweetest young ladies (picture #2) requested...more like pleaded, "Please, please, please can we have Dr. Vara and his wife again?" With such enthusiasm, you have to honor a request like that! Right? The other kids were paired up with their volunteers and headed off to get their skis, poles, and helmets. After tackling some of the challenges associated with skiing gear (who designed those darn ski boots anyway?!?) it was off to the slopes!

The progress the kids make year-after-year is truly astonishing! Considering most of the kids only ski once a year while at Camp Achieve, seeing their confidence and excitement grow is inspiring, joyful and gratifying. Some kids were more adventurous than others and little Colleen (picture #3) is a perfect example. Colleen's volunteer suggested she try a snowboard, and as the picture indicates.... initially that wasn't a good idea. However, nothing stops Colleen and after a little practice and better balance, Colleen was going smoothly down the hill in no time.

The skiers came in for a pizza lunch, excited about their progress and sharing stories (and perhaps exaggerating) about the "big hills" they had conquered. While the smiles were fresh on their faces, the kids then assembled for a group photo. Afterwards new skiing partners were assigned and everyone headed back out onto the slopes.

It goes without saying that the day would not have been possible without all the volunteers, especially those who are ski instructors and those that are able to ski. Despite the fact these volunteers gave up a (perfect) weekend day to help, both new and return volunteers alike, expressed they were glad to be part of such a wonderful day and mentioned they look forward to volunteering again next year.

Winter Camp Achieve is a perfect example of how it takes a village – a "ski village" – to give these kids a memorable day of winter fun and accomplishment. By the end of the day the fun, exhilaration, and cool outdoor winter air turned extremely excited kids into tired and sleepy kids, making for a very quiet Saturday night. You're welcome parents. 

Stated Meeting - February 13, 2019

Minutes: Minutes of the January meeting were printed in the Tattler and a motion to dispense with the reading was made and seconded. A vote was called and passed. Minutes were accepted as printed.

<u>Petitions</u>: Petition from James J. Goodman was read. Top line signer was Noble George Jozwiak. A ballot was spread and the meeting continued awaiting results. The Potentate explained the new system for Membership. He introduced the members of the membership committee, Nobles Al Iding, Doug Winter, Gerry Arnholt, Bob Manders and Walter Neuman.

Financial Report: The treasurer pointed out the high points of the report which were distributed on the tables. \$150,00.00 was withdrawn from the investment account to cover expenses of the Circus. Money will be replaced from Circus. Switching banks from BMO Harris to Tri-City is almost complete. John asked all units to turn in their financial reports so we can file our taxes. Our CPA is setting up a new system for paying our bills. The new system will allow for better tracking of our expenses. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. The motion passed and the report was accepted.

Ballot on Petition: The ballot was returned. It was clear and Mr. Goodman's petition was granted. Potentate Capen presented Noble Jozwiak with an "I am RU" pin. At the March meeting Badgerland IT group will give us a presentation to show us how to use the new website.

Finance Committee: P.P. Doug Winter explained the look of the financial report. During the month we were served with a frivolous lawsuit from the 2015 Circus. Doug explained the what he had to do to end the subject.

Black Camel: Two Nobles joined the caravan to the Celestial Oasis since our last meeting, Nobles James Luft, Vito Colano. A prayer was offered on their behalf.

<u>Sick and Distressed:</u> The list was distributed on the Tables. Orator Neil Laack is in rehab.

Trustees: Everything is running well at this time.

Scimitar: Sportsman night will be March 22, 2019. We still need tables to be sold. We would like to get 400+ attendance. Noble Arnholt thanked the trustees for the great job they did of taking care of the water damage from the recent storm. The Tripoli golf outing will be June 24th, 2019 at the Fairways of Woodside golf course. All money earned will go to the Hospital. We need 144 golfers to participate. Our goal is \$20,000.00.

<u>**Transportation:**</u> Currently the Balance in the account is \$21,849.17. Balance sounds good but it was explained that during January and February we had to make a trip up to For 8 du Lac to serve a patient. Due to the accident which

totaled our van with the lift we needed to rent a van which is handicap accessible 4 times. Plus we had 3 trips using our van.

Hospital: Nothing at this time.

<u>Circus</u>: Nobles Pete Hennig P.P. and John Orth gave the report. The arena has to have extra security due to the PETA protesters. We need to be extra vigilant when entering or exiting the building to make sure none sneek in. Security will be checking all who try to enter. Help is needed to sell Programs. It is a great way to make money for the temple and your unit. A \$3.00 program gives \$2.00 to the Temple and \$1.00 goes to the unit selling it.

Technical Director: Noble Sean Schult informed us that he is a volunteer position. He just wants to make sure our system is up to the highest standards and capable to handle anything we might need. He informed us that the wi-fi is being up-graded along with the sound system. Using his contacts he was able to get microphones from the South Milwaukee Performing Arts Center donated to the Temple. In the future he will be applying for grants to upgrade our stage lighting.


Trustee: Noble Art Karos was installed as Trustee by Ill. Sir Capen.






