

Potentate's Message

Robert Capen

Last month I and your Divan visited Shriners Hospital for Children on the official yearly "Hospital Divan Day". It was a great day as we toured the hospital, attended a luncheon where certificates were presented, and capped off in the afternoon by a presentation by hospital staff and our patient ambassador Conner Wright and his family. It was a moving story told by Conner and his mother Kathy. She told the story of the sleepless nights and constant worry of Conner's condition and if he would ever live a "normal" life. Conner was born with a cleft palate and serious facial issues. He has undergone several surgeries and now looks amazing. His goal is to be a national hospital ambassador for Shriners Hospital for Children. He is an inspirational young man. I tell you this story because it is a miracle that we are driving (the theme of my potentate pin... Driving Miracles). Conner and his family faced adversity, but have come out of stronger and Conner is determined to make a difference.

Tripoli, like Conner and his family are facing a challenge in our fraternal financial life. It is one that also causes worry and concern. How we face it is important. We cannot just brush it aside or hope it will go away. I have often stated that hope is not a strategy. We all will have to make some hard decisions and ask ourselves some tough questions. Why am I a Shriner? Is the legacy of our historical building important? Am I willing to make a difference like Conner? What can I do? Do I want to help? There is no right or wrong answer, but we will each have to look inward for that direction. Last month, I gathered our Divan to discuss the direction of our Circus, and it was decided that we would move our traditional date from February to May of 2020. It will be the weekend of Mother's day that year. It is our thought that this will move us away from the competition of other popular family events (Disney on Ice, Monster Trucks, etc.). It will also be at a time of the year where weather should not have a detrimental effect on our attendance. There has even been discussion of giving mothers free attendance to our Circus as a marketing strategy.

I also called together a meeting of our club presidents and unit heads to discuss our situation and map out a plan. It was a constructive meeting and I thank all of you for attending. We spoke about a lot of ideas to put us on a fiscally strong path. Again, not everyone liked what was proposed. Some Nobles will be satisfied with the plan, others will not. We understand that the course changes will be stressful for some. So here are some of the proposals that were discussed.

Dues: It is being proposed that we ask for a special onetime voluntary assessment of \$30.00 or more per Noble to help us bridge the shortfall caused by the poor performance of our circus. We are hopeful that some Nobles will be more generous than those that might not be able to support this request. It was also proposed that we raise our dues \$5.00 per year as a standard yearly increase. We will need to vote on this at our next stated meeting. Your Divan believes this is a reasonable adjustment to our current dues structure. We can cease this incremental increase if we so choose in the future. The last time we raised our dues was in the 1980's. I don't think it needs to be explained that a \$1.00 in 1980 doesn't goes as far in 2019. Our current dues when you break it down (\$135.00...\$35.00 is per capita) is less than \$8.50 per month. What is the value of being a Tripoli Shriner? I believe most would think its priceless based on what we do to make kids' lives better and the fun and fellowship we enjoy as a fraternity.

Red Fez: It has been proposed to add \$10.00 to our dues to contribute to the Red Fez Fund of which all members of Tripoli belong. Red Fez is our organization that hosts and plans our annual "Bunny Brunch" and "Santa Breakfast" each year. It's what we do for creating fun for kids. Red Fez is also the entity that is responsible for supporting the infrastructure needs of our Temple...kitchen needs, furniture, banquet tables, etc. All the upgrades and replacements that might be needed over time. Our Scimitar Foundation can only address building structural needs or improvements. It is critical that we have a constant mechanism in place to fund these events and needs for our Shrine. We will need to vote on this at our next stated meeting.

More Fundraising Events: We discussed the need to have more fundraising events not just at the Temple level but club and units too. We are asking all clubs and units to give their financial resources to Tripoli. Or host new activities that will be fun and raise funds for Tripoli. We are now a member of the Shrine Fundraising Association. It is an association that has dozens of successful fundraising events that they will share with any group that wants to learn. Our own Feztival of Trees is one such event being utilized by many other Shrines. Our hospital system has an endowment of over 8.5 billion dollars. The hospital does not need the money. That doesn't mean we don't want to support our hospitals. We do, but we are going to support it with other fundraisers that will need your participation. Our annual golf outing June 24th (see flyer insert) which has a committee that is working hard to take it to a whole other level. We believe we can generate 10-20 thousand dollars at this charity event. And our new partnership with Locust Street Feztival on June 9th (see flyer insert) where we will be an active participant in helping to run the event with our volunteers. This event also has potential to raise tens of thousands of dollars for Scimitar Foundation. Both these events will give us high visibility in the public domain and raise awareness to who we are and what we do.

Open House: It was discussed that it was way overdue to do a spring cleaning at Tripoli. During the next month (May), we are asking all units to clean up their unit rooms and "spruce" them up. A large waste container will be provided to dispose of unneeded items or items of disrepair. If you have furnishings like sofas or chairs, we are asking you to bring them to the Scimitar Room for gathering. Other units may exchange for them. When the cleanup is completed, the Salvation Army will come and pick up all these items. This is what they do...fix old furniture and provide them for people that are in need. After all this is done, we want to host an Open House (food, appetizers, and drinks will be served) where we put our best foot forward and show off our beautiful building. It is the best asset that we have and we should be proud of it. We will advertise this in the Masonic Journal and we ask that you communicate it at your Blue Lodges. Membership is still a major focus and this will be an opportunity to invite Masons to our Unit rooms and Shrine.

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Temple Needs: It was also discussed that we should create a list of needs for our Shrine. That there might be Nobles that would be willing to step up and provide for a specific need. I know my own church has done this and you would be surprised how many members would be willing to give when they know there is something specific that is needed. This has already been demonstrated when the need was expressed to replace our plate ware in the banquet business. A list will be prepared, but here are some items that were prepared by our trustees:

Fencing - \$4,500.00

New Cooler-Freezer (current one has issues and will not pass health inspection) - \$15,000.00

Pair of ovens - 15,000.00

20 ea. 8ft Rectangular Banquet Tables - \$75.00 ea.

20 ea. 6ft Rectangular Banquet Tables - \$55.00 ea.

20 ea. 72" Round Banquet Tables - \$165.00 ea.

20 ea. 60" Round Banquet Tables - 115.00 ea.

300 ea. Banquet Chairs - \$40.00 ea.

Banquet Business: Banquet business under Dave Bowen is getting better. It is a slow process, however as shared before, our website inquiries are improving monthly. Our SEO campaign is working and more and more people are visiting our awesome website. The activity level of use in our building is increasing. And the announcement of the DNC being hosted in Milwaukee should produce some great opportunities. We are also going to be more consistent in what we charge for all that use our facilities. We often are overly generous to our fraternally related organizations. We can no longer do this at a loss to Tripoli. However, we will be fair in our structure to these groups.

Expenses: Your finance committee is looking at all expenditures and cutting back where savings can be made. As you know, we did cut back on our office staffing as one of the areas where our costs were not in balance with our needs. This will be a constant endeavor. It was also noted that nothing can be purchased without board approval. This has always been the case, but we are being more rigid about this policy. A new budget has been structured and if followed, we feel we can weather this bump in our finances.

This is a partial reprint of an article written long ago by a Tripoli Chaplain but the message is perhaps even more important in today's world.



The psalmist wrote, "so teach us to number our days that we get a heart of wisdom."

This psalm carries a revelation of the significance of time that for us constitutes a warning. It is one of the gracious warnings from God, because it leads men to take heed and make wise preparations for what lies ahead.

The fact of the warning is that the days of our years are numbered, and we must learn to number them for ourselves. But it is hard for us to do because we don't know that number, and because we don't think about it, we forget they are numbered at all.

God would have you conscious of the realities of life and death, because good judgment depends on having good information. God thinks that we ought to know that some night; it will stay dark for good. The psalmist uses many metaphors to bring to mind the shortness of life. In one, He likens us to the grasses of the desert, which spring to life each morning green and fresh in the dew, only to dry and wither in the afternoon sun.

The value of a warning lays in the use to which it was put. This warning may be valuable in arousing the sluggish, or awakening the complacent. Fear indeed has its uses, and is God-given to prepare us for an escape to safety.

God's warning should be the Word that teaches us to apply our hearts to wisdom, here and now. What is wisdom in the face of numbered days? It is making the time count; it is remembering that in the end the things that count are the things that you can't count. You will find that the highest joy of our time comes in using it for eternal purposes.

Yes, the wisdom of this warning is gracious. God sends His grace to teach us to redeem the time, and to repossess it. So use it wisely.

Patient shares memorable moments at Shriners Hospitals for Children

Thursday, April 4, 2019

Spending time in the sun or going out with friends is typically what most kids want to do during summer vacation, but for Claudia, summertime often meant medical treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston. She has been a patient at the Houston Shriners Hospital since she was 3, and to avoid missing school her parents tried to schedule her appointments during the summer.

Claudia and her parents made the trips from Tampico, Mexico, to Houston, where they trusted she would receive the best possible care.

"From the time they did the initial evaluation, we were very surprised with the care and all the help that they have provided for us. It has been fabulous. We are very happy," said Jesus, Claudia's father.

Claudia was born with a left forearm length discrepancy, which requires regular evaluations as she grows. She has undergone four surgeries and most recently received bone-lengthening treatment. The length of her hospital stays varied from a few days to a few months, depending on the treatment or procedure required.

In addition to orthopaedic services, Claudia also had regular check-ups for linear epidermal nevus, a skin condition that often goes untreated and requires regular monitoring for signs of progression.

Growing up, Claudia never set limits for herself. Throughout her school years she has done ballet and cheerleading, and has played different sports. Claudia is now 18 and said she likes to play the guitar and sing, but her main goal is to pursue a career in biotechnologies and genetics.

Looking back, Claudia and her family said the memories amassed at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston are many. From birthday cake surprises with the outpatient nurses to unique doctor-patient relationships, Claudia said she always felt at home.



"I've had amazing experiences at Shriners, and the one thing that I will never forget is my doctor, Dr. Gogola," Claudia said.

Claudia and her family built meaningful life-long relationships with doctors, nurses and other staff members, something they said they will never forget.

Stated Meeting Minutes

April 10, 2019

Introductions: New Members, visiting members, Past Potentates, trustees, Unit Heads and Shrine club Presidents were introduced.

Minutes: A motion was made and seconded, to accept the minutes as posted in the Tattler. A vote was called and the Motion Passed. The minutes of the April meeting were accepted.

Hospital: Hospital is well funded and looking for ways to find more patients. Noble Matt Wright informed us that we also have informational literature in Spanish to help Hispanic patients. Ill. Sir Capen informed us that Shriners Hospital is the Number 2 "Branded "Hospital in the US. A new program to get more patients will be starting soon.

Circus: P.P. Pete Hennig gave the report. The 2020 circus dates were moved from February to May for reasons given. Nobles Hennig and Orth have tendered their resignations and new Chairpersons are needed. Ill. Sir Capen asked all the units to help fund the Temple.




