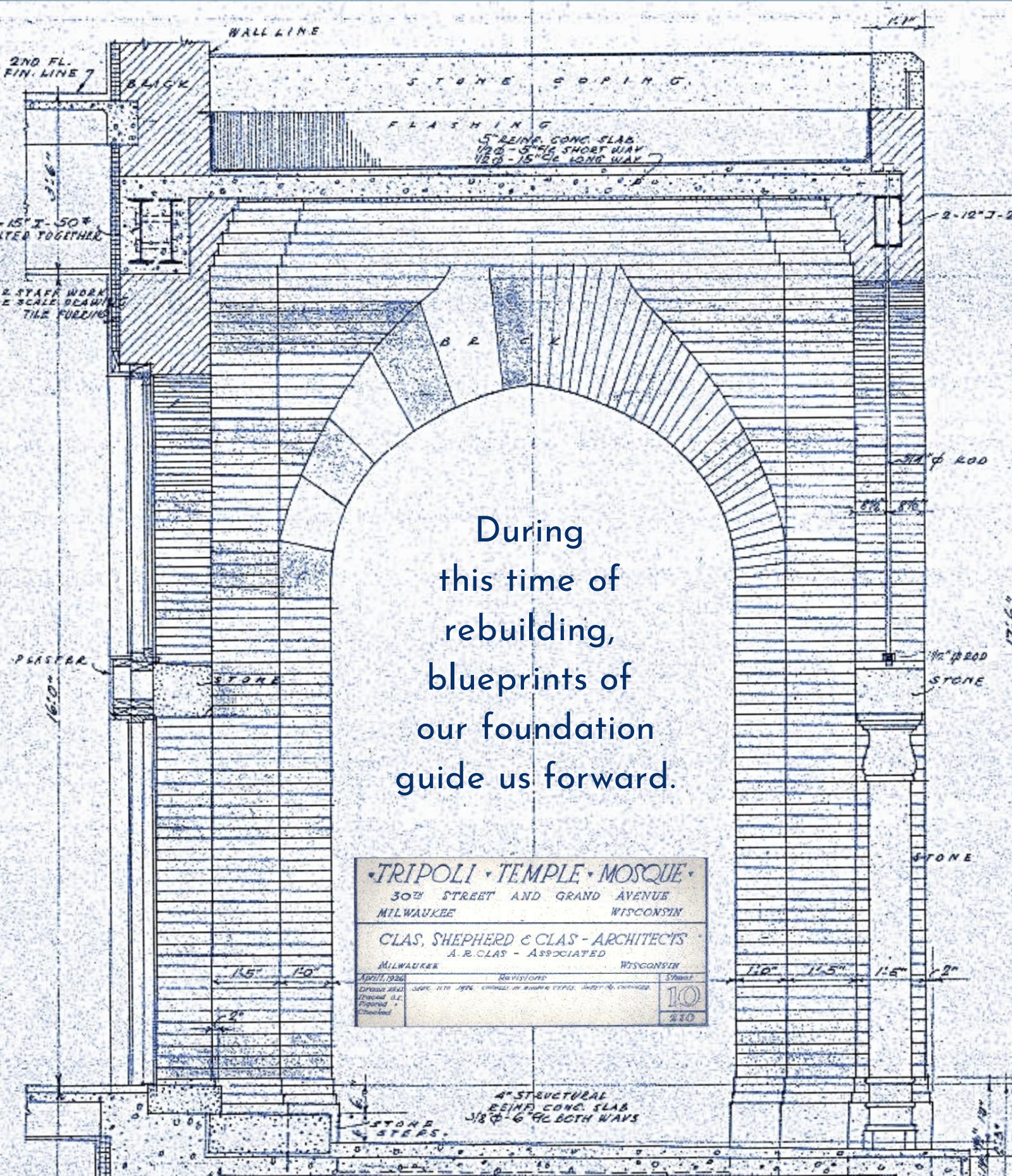

The Oldest Living Shriners Hospitals for Children Patient Turns 103!



Irene Hand Roberts just turned 103 and as far as we know, she is the oldest living Shriners Hospitals for Children patient! Irene was born on April 28, 1917, at her grandmother's restaurant and boarding hotel in McLaughlin, South Dakota.

In July 1923, at the age of 6, Irene developed what was called infantile paralysis, but is now known as polio. The Hand family and local doctors tried many remedies to help Irene, but they were all unsuccessful. Irene's luck changed when a small town horse-and-buggy doctor named Dr. Twining, who by chance was a Shriner, referred Irene to the newly opened Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children in Minnesota, thus beginning Irene's long and very hard road to recovery.

Irene spent many months at the Shriners Hospital in Minnesota. Her right leg recovered, but her right arm never did. Irene never let having a paralyzed right arm slow her down, though.

Back home Irene had to work very hard to catch up, as she had missed her entire second-grade year. With only one good arm, she experienced many challenges. Yet as time went on, Irene adjusted to her new life and learned how to do things differently.

In 1930, Irene's father moved the family to Miles City, Montana, after finding work as a railroad policeman for the Milwaukee Railroad. Irene was a determined young woman. After graduating from high school, she was in the first graduating class at the new Eastern Montana College in Billings, Montana, where she earned her teaching degree. After graduating, Irene taught school for one year in a one-room school in Ismay, Montana.



Irene met and married Byron Roberts when she was 21, and they have eight children spread out over 22 years. Irene has quite a few grandchildren, and two of her grandsons and one great-grandson played in the Montana East-West Shrine Football game! The family feels this is one way they have given back for the care Irene received from Shriners Hospital.

As a surprise for her 103rd birthday, Shriners Hospitals for Children patients and staff, as well as Imperial Potentate Jeffrey Sowder, put together this video for Irene:

Anniversary of the *Editorial Without Words*

The photo known as the "Editorial Without Words" is one of the Shriners fraternity's most recognizable images

It was taken almost by accident, 50 years ago, on June 11, 1970, in Evansville, Indiana. This special moment, captured for all time, eloquently illustrates the relationship between the Shriners fraternity and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Hadi Shriners in Evansville was holding its annual summer picnic. Patients were invited, and everyone enjoyed a day of food, fun and carnival rides. Toward the end of the day, Shriner Al Hortman, who became a Shriner after his daughter, Laura, was treated at Shriners Hospitals for Children, noticed a young girl who needed help. On this day, Noble Hortman lifted Bobbi Jo Wright and her crutches and carried her from ride to ride. A local newspaper photographer, Randy Dieter, captured the photo with a long lens as the two walked past him. Dieter wouldn't realize until much later how much impact that single image would have. Neither would the Shriners, or Bobbi Jo herself.

Today, Bobbi Jo lives independently and is active in her church. She spends much time and energy traveling and speaking on behalf of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and meeting and encouraging other patients and families.

The famous photo has been reproduced on stained-glass windows, mosaics, tie tacks, pins and more. A larger-than-life replica of the "Editorial Without Words" stands outside the Shriners International Headquarters building in Tampa, Florida, and statues mark many temples and Shriners Hospitals locations. A version of the image is used as the Shriners Hospitals for Children logo.

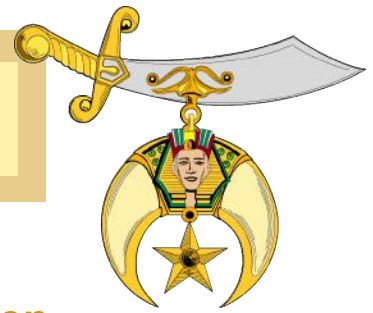

Brave Young Man Veteran of Many Surgeries

When we first met seventeen year old Brock Haverland of New Richmond on March 2, the first thing he showed off was his many scares from the eleven surgeries he underwent at the Shriners Hospital for Children.® To Brock it appeared as a sign of a long term brave struggle.

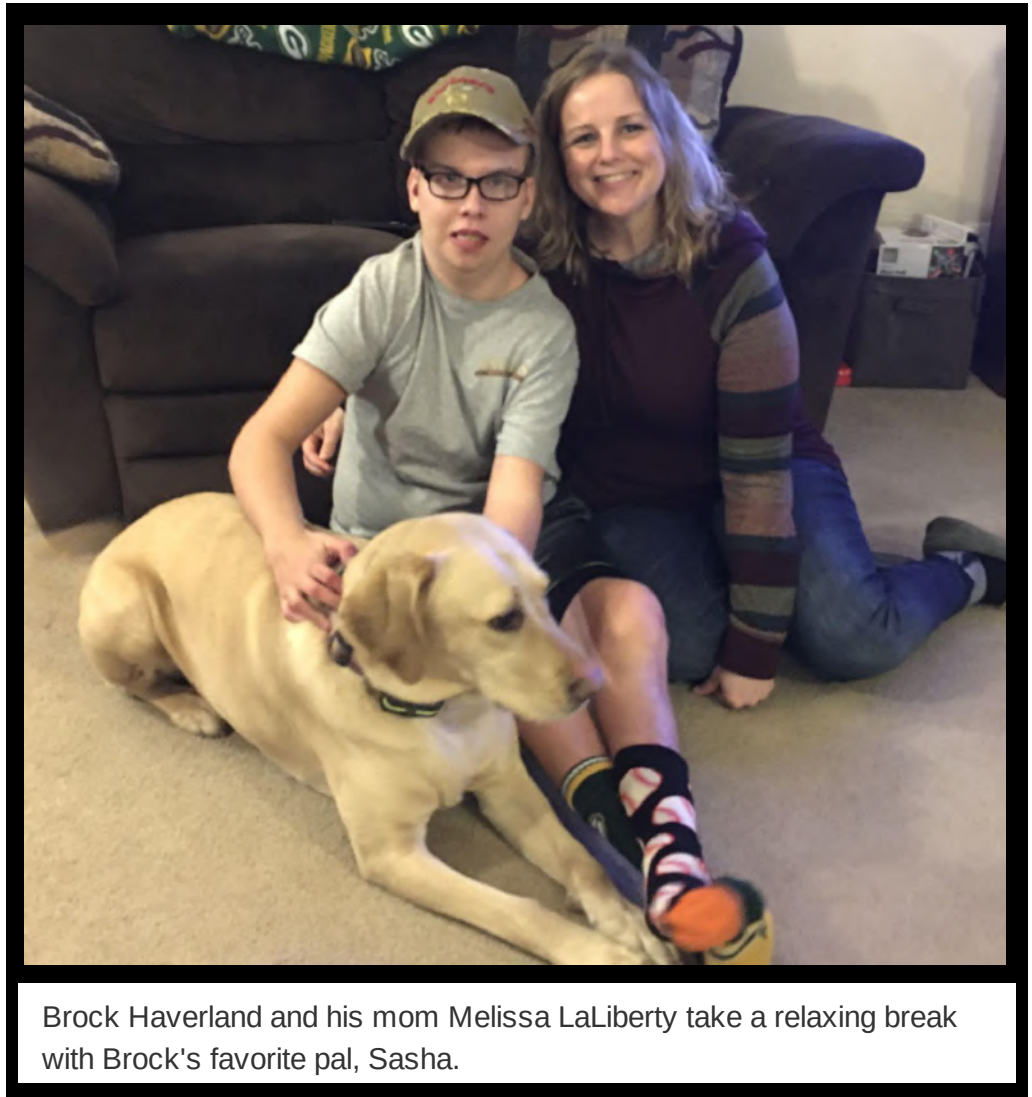
Brock's journey started with treatment for a club foot, a problem he had from birth. He was receiving treatment at Gillette Hospital in the Twin Cities. When he was just 2 years old his mother Melissa LaLiberty, said "The treatments and surgeries were starting to mount up".

In the fall of 2004 she read a story in the paper about a boy who was treated by Shriners and was named parade marshal of a coming shrine parade. She said to herself, "I've got to find me a Shriner."

She started asking around and learned that her father was having coffee with one of the guys at Johnson Motors and he said Curt Anderson, Johnson's owner was a Shriner. The message got to Curt and from that moment on her and son Brock's life changed.

Anderson lined Brock up with the Shriners Hospital of Children® in the Twin Cities. Brock was in a walker at the time. His club foot required a lot of expensive surgeries. He also was diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder named 49XXXXY Syndrome. The disorder caused his bones to grown at different times so he was forced to have surgery to correct the differences as he grew.

So far he has logged 11 surgeries. The most recent in 2018. In 2016 he had to

have one bone cut in his leg due to the bone twisting. Brock is still due for more surgery which will be done by the Shriners Surgical team at Gillette.

Brock and his family found the Shriners Hospital friendly and treated them like family. Along the way Brock got an infection in the blood due to his weakened immune system. His surgeon, Dr. Mielke, has since been transferred down south, but he left him his cell phone number with orders to send him photographs of his treatments so he could keep up on his progress.

Brock is attending New Richmond High School and keeps busy with his hobby of archery. He and his mother and his step dad shoot in winter and summer leagues.

This active teenager still has two to three more surgeries for sure and will continue to receive care through the Shriners Healthcare for Children® in Woodbury.

With all the setbacks this active family remains positive and upbeat regardless of their many trials. Melissa's ex-husband is still in Brock's life and has been supportive.

Brock will serve as Grand Marshal of the Shrine and University homecoming game this fall. He will also be the guest of honor at the Potentate's banquet October 2nd and lead the parade on Saturday Oct 3rd plus be introduced at the Little East West Shrine

Mystic Brewers

Nobles and Ladies,

Were you aware that there is actually a patron saint for beer? St. Arnold of Soissons. I found this information on Wikipedia and thought you would find this interesting.

St. Arnold, born in Brabant (a city west of Brussels), the son of a certain Fulbertus was first a career soldier before settling at the Benedictine St. Medard's Abbey, in Soissons, France. He spent his first three years as a hermit, but later rose to be abbot of the monastery. His biography states that he tried to refuse this honor and fled, but was forced to return. He then became a priest and in 1080 the bishop of Soissons, another honor that he sought to avoid. After years of service as Bishop he retired from public life, founding the Abbey of St. Peter in Oudenburg.

As abbot in Oudenburg, Arnold brewed beer, as essential in medieval life as water. He encouraged local peasants to drink beer, instead of water, due to its "gift of health". During the process of brewing, the water was boiled and thus, unknown to all, freed of pathogens, making the beer safer to drink. The beer normally consumed at breakfast and during the day at this time in Europe was called small beer, having a very low alcohol content, and containing spent yeast. It is likely that people in the local area normally consumed small beer from the monastery, or made their own small beer at the instructions of Arnold and his fellow monks.

During one outbreak of sickness, Arnold advised the local people to avoid consuming water, in favor of beer, this wise advice effectively saved lives.

One miracle tale says, at the time of an epidemic, rather than stand by while the local people fell ill from drinking water, Arnold had them consume his monastery brews. Because of this, many people in his church survived the plague. This same story is also told of Arnulf or Arnold of Metz, another patron of brewers. There are many depictions of St. Arnold with a mashing rake in his hand to identify him. He is honored in July with a parade in Brussels on the "Day of Beer."

Miracles that were reported at his tomb were investigated and approved by a council at Beauvais in 1121. St. Arnold's relics were transferred to the church of Saint Peter, Aldenburg in 1131. St. Arnold's feast day is August 14th.

I hope you enjoyed this beer trivia. Please keep brewing and I look forward to getting together with all of you in the upcoming month.
