

Stated Meeting Minutes

Wed, Sept 12th

Prior to the opening of Tripoli Temple, a presentation was made by Brethren of Damascus Lodge #290. They presented III Sir Rick Kingstad a check in the amount of \$1900 to be used to purchase new silverware for Tripoli. This is to honor III Sir Rick in being the first member of Damascus Lodge to serve as Potentate of Tripoli Shrine. III Sir Ricked thanked the Brethren for the great gift and said that they hope to have it for use at the upcoming Sportsman Night. He also added that he had Tripoli petitions if anyone was interested.

The stated meeting was opened in due form at 7:05PM by III. Potentate Richard Kingstad.
All officers were present except Joe Brunk and Neil Laack.

Chaplain Ron Hack offered an opening prayer.

The flag of the United States of America was presented by the Legion of Honor and the Potentate led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer's report was given by Treasurer John Bugajski. He noted that our Imperial Hospital Assessment and Per Capita Tax has been paid. We will be receiving a partial refund from Imperial due to the cancellation of the 2020 Imperial Session. This is to help offset the Temple shutdowns due to the

COVID-19 pandemic. Motion made, seconded, and passed to accept the report.

Black Camel: HP and P Dale Graeven read the roll of the workmen summoned by the Black Camel since our last meeting. The following Nobles answered not: Clarence Fruik, Jr, Eugene Johnson, William C Kirchner, Lawrence Presnell, Peter W Stathas, William J VanZile, Vincent L Shuler, Khristian Kay, Frederick L Jorgenson, William E Nelsen, and Thomas J Cole.

The Chaplain offered a prayer for our departed Brothers and included the Lighting of 3 candles and a prayer to honor and remember the tragedy of September 11 (9/11) 19 years ago.

Chaplain Ron Hack reported on sickness and distress. Past Chaplain John Bennethum helps with the sickness and distress list. The complete listing will be available by the next meeting. Any additions or updates please contact John or Ron.

PP Doug Winter reported on the Finance Committee. Due to the COVID-19 shutdowns we lost all our outside events. The majority have rescheduled. Our first wedding is schedule for 9/11. We also have revenue from 4 lodges, the DeMolay office, the Learning Center, and Verizon. The Verizon building has been completed. They also replaced the fencing along 29th street and we lost only 5 parking spaces. Revenue from Verizon will be about \$21,000 per year.

He also informed us the Our Savior Lutheran Church has been sold to UWM and will be used in conjunction with MPS as a 5th year high school. They have been renting space in our building for initial sessions.

The fish fries have been a great success. The income has covered all expenses and enabled us to meet our payroll during the shutdown. They will be discontinued for now due to startup of other activities.

Scimitar Report: – OG Gerry Arnold reported reminded everyone of Sportsman's Night on September 25. We need everyone's help for this event including buying and selling tables and tickets as well as volunteers. See Dave Bevsek if interested in volunteering.

- 4) Tripoli Shrine Car Show was held at the Bevsek-Verbick Funeral Home in Muskego. It again was successful and brought in about \$5000. Thanks to Dave and the volunteers.
- 5) Tripoli Golf Outing has just concluded. It was successful and final numbers should be in by the next meeting.

PM Tom Schlicht presented information on a Florida Fruit Sale. All orders are made online, product is delivered direct to the customer's home, Tripoli makes a profit on each sales. Tentatively scheduled for the week before Thanksgiving. More information to follow.



Captain of the Guard Damon Albers presented a check to Tripoli Temple in the amount of \$9500 on behalf of the Zarse and Albers family.

This matches a check for the same amount presented earlier this year.

Potentate Rick Kingstad introduced the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Wisconsin Kenneth C. Gorgen. Noble Ken remarked how COVID-19 has made for a most unusual year and it's great to see us getting back to work. He also thanked the membership for his "Grand Master" fez. He is looking forward to all Masonic bodies moving forward with a great year.

Nobel Frank Foti came forward with the split the pot raffle. There was \$410 in the pot so the winner will receive \$205. The winner was Noble Mary Laack.

Shriners Hospital for Children Outfits 8-year-old Patient

WITH 1ST 3D PRINTED BIONIC ARM

SPRINGFIELD, MASS. (WHDH) - Shriners Hospital recently outfitted an 8-year-old Lynnfield boy with its first custom-built, 3D printed bionic arm that was made to look like Marvel superhero Iron Man.

The Hero Arm device was customized for Sam, a bilateral amputee, in collaboration with a company in the United Kingdom to ensure he can live his life to the fullest, according to Shriners.

Engineers specifically designed the Hero Arm as a myoelectric prosthesis for below elbow amputees. When a user intentionally flexes specific muscles in their residual limb, EMG electrodes within the Hero Arm detect tiny electrical signals, allowing them to activate different grips with precise control.

Sam, who first came to Shriners in Boston in 2018 following amputations resulting from a bacterial infection, is now receiving prosthetic care from the health system's location in Springfield.

The Hero Arm will enable him to engage more fully in all the sports and activities he loves including baseball, basketball, and playing with his friends and younger siblings. It will also make dressing, eating, cooking and other self-care tasks easier.

"It is an amazing gift that our family is incredibly grateful for,"





"We selected Sam to be the first patient to receive the Hero Arm because we knew it would help him do all the things he currently enjoys while providing an opportunity to develop fine motor skills and greater independence," said Brock McConkey, Manager of Orthotics and Prosthetics at Shriners Hospitals for Springfield. Children – "It's also lightweight and durable, which is perfect for a boy as young and active as Sam." Sam's mother, Michelle, said the arm has "significantly" improved her son's quality of life.

Leaders in Care



What makes a couple with four young biological children decide to adopt two teenage boys with overwhelming disabilities from a Ukrainian orphanage? Jackie of Salt Lake City, Utah, would tell you she didn't decide. She and her husband, David, felt called to take these boys in. That calling, rooted in a strong Christian faith, was the catalyst for their decision to pursue the boys with all of their hearts.

Neglected in their care, Jonah 17, who has spina bifida and Miles 16, who was the size of a baby lived at the same orphanage. The adoption went through just in time when both were close to death. complications of life-threatening pressure, osteomyelitis (an infection in the bone) and septic, their lives were changes when the family arrived home. Mobility was the last thing on the adoptive parents' minds as they addressed Miles' nutrition and Jonah's emergent wound care.

When the boys' doctors advised the family to wait on mobility and seating Jackie and David trusted their instincts and pressed for more and they found it at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Salt Lake City. Everything changed with the help of the surgeons, seating specialists and physical therapists. "Both of my boys are incredibly medically complex, but Shriners Hospitals doesn't even bat an eye," said Jackie. "Everyone at the hospital has been so accommodating, and no mobility challenge presented to them has been outside their scope.

A safe, custom wheelchair for Jonah is what prevents pressure sores that could kill him. For Miles, encouraging his mobility is ultimately what opened up his world cognitively." A whole new world for Miles The staff of the hospital's wheelchair and seating and therapy services departments wanted to give Miles a way to be mobile as

soon as possible because of the link between mobility and cognition. Once his therapist placed him upon a crawler – a small board with wheels (like a square skateboard) – he experienced self-propelling for the first time His face lit up with joy as he began scooting himself around, and Jackie began imagining all the possibilities for his quality of life. They also swapped the baby stroller for a custom wheelchair. The mobility interventions made a marked difference in Miles' cognition.

Matt Lowell, MPT, said treating the boys has been amazing to watch. "We have really enjoyed working with the family and seeing the boys develop, not only their mobility, but their social and physical health as well," he said. "Miles had gained so much weight that from the time his chair was ordered to the time it was delivered, we actually had to send it back and go to the next size. The family is so caring, and they're such great advocates for the boys."

Living a full life, it's been a year and a half since the boys were adopted, and they're thriving. Miles has grown more than 12 inches and tripled in weight. He's even begun talking, saying "gaga" and "baba." Jonah's had critical wound care and is sitting up taller, thanks to spinal fusion and endless mobility interventions. The parents and their specialists at the Salt Lake City Shriners Hospital are dreaming big for the boys. Jonah is on the hospital's wait list for an adaptive bike, and they're looking into self-propel wheelchair options for Miles. The boys have put down strong roots in their new, loving home but now their definition of home is expansive in a way it's never been. They're at home at Shriners Hospitals for Children. More than a hospital, it's a place where the staff and Shriners




