In my final article, talking about the line of succession, where nobles take on each position in *line*, Oriental Guide, High Priest and Prophet, Assistant Rabban and finally, Chief Rabban - Matt Wright, I will try to give you an idea of what he is made of. Well, he is not made of Spam but does come from the home of spam, Austin, Minnesota and born in 1972. Matt is a very creative person who works for the government which is his own personal dilemma. Actually, he works for the Department of Veterans Affairs. "I realize everyone hates the government and hates government workers, but I do feel I am helping people" Matt said, "and being a veteran myself, I feel my work is somewhat important." He loves to tinker around the house and in his free time he golfs, drives his motorcycle and goes to his uncles cabin up north near Eau Claire.

He initially joined Freemasonry in 1993 while stationed in Heidelberg Germany, serving in the US Army. That lodge was a Prince Hall Affiliated Lodge. With several bumps in the road, as he said, he took a 14year hiatus. At the end of that, being a biker, he looked up Freemasons and motorcycles and found the Widow's Sons Masonic Riders Association, which met at Lake Masonic Center in St. Francis. Matt became a Shriner in 2010. He originally joined the Highlander Unit but was terrible at playing the drums. While helping the Longriders Unit at the Wisconsin Dells parade, hetalked with Past Potentate Keith Sargeant about his little car, and Page 4

then he joined the Motor Corps and purchase his own Scarab. He is also a member of the Director's Staff, the Ritualistic Divan, the Animals Unit, The Red Fez, and the Circus Committee. The first Shrine Club he joined was the Waukesha Shrine Club, and recently became a member of Tri-County Shrine club, a member of Milwaukee Caravanserai #2, and El Hajj. Matt is also the Shriners Children's Health Clinic - Twin Cities Representative.

When asking him about his wife he could not say enough. Matt and Cathi were married in 2004, shortly after moving to Milwaukee. Matt said, "I love my wife more than life itself, she's my best friend, she makes me laugh, she listens when I'm frustrated, she's supportive when I'm sad, and best of all, she understands that Shrine is my thing." Matt went on "She's supportive when and where I need support, which is often misconstrued by people from previous generations, because others see her absence from events as not being supportive of what I'm doing." He was passionate when saying "I often do not ask Cathi to come to

often do not ask Cathi to come to Shrine events and there are specific reasons why; but to reiterate, if I wanted her to be at an event, she would be there. Again, the Shrine is my thing, and she has her 'things' that she doesn't ask me to participate in, which we believe is healthy for our

relationship."

His goal for his upcoming position as Potentate is to change his thinking. He had gotten caught up in the 'assignment of blame' way of thinking, which is highly corrosive to any team or organization. He said that so many of us get stuck in the exhaustive practice of asking "who's fault is this?" each time a problem occurs. Problems can be solved so much faster if each of us ask "What can we do to fix this?" instead of trying to find out who caused the problem simply to assign blame. Not only that, but he said each time we fix a problem together, it builds comradery, and the team becomes better at fixing problems as a group. He also plans to rely on his Brothers more. "I have already learned some

more. "I have already learned some important lessons this year, and the most important one is to share my concerns with my fellow Nobles/Brothers. Odds are, the concerns we are having, have occurred many times over in the past; and good Nobles have already asked the important question 'what can we do to fix this problem' and solved the same concerns I'm having many times over," said Matt.

He hopes his change of thinking will encourage others to reflect on their own way of thinking. "Many of our Nobles seem to be stuck in the past and what is worse, dwell on the past. Too many times we hear 'we've already tried that...' or 'we've done that in the past...' or worst yet, 'I'm still upset about what happened back in 19*" Matt explained to me. "It's all in the past and water underneath the bridge. That type of thinking is particularly frustrating when we encourage our younger Nobles, in age or age as a member, to present new ideas and programs; but then reply to those Nobles with comments from the past". Everyone has heard the saying, 'Timing is everything' and the reason an idea or an event may fail is simply due to wrong timing. Not only that, but successes don't often happen instantly. Failures are lessons, lessons that need to be examined by asking questions, and the first question to ask is, "what can we do or what needs to be done to fix the problems?" Matt answered "When talking about the persistent challenge of membership, remembering and constantly bringing up the fact that Tripoli once had 8,000 Nobles does nothing to help fix the membership problem, but asking what techniques



they used back then or the lessons they learned to build up the membership to that level would be helpful. Again, let's not live in the past, but remember the lessons learned from the past, and use those lessons to better our future."

In the near future, Matt hopes to see himself with a Master of Science degree that he has been working hard on the last couple of years. He has had to miss practically every parade, with the Motor Corp, the last couple of years because he needed to take summer classes. He has only one class left and has to do decide whether to put it off until 2023 or see if he can fit into his busy schedule as Potentate. "To successfully complete that class in 2022, I'll need all the assistance and encouragement I can get from the Nobility. I sincerely would not be able to do it without them." Matt added.

He finished with "The way the Tripoli Family pulled together during the COVID pandemic in 2020, and the way they continued to provide their support by pitching in to help with our fund-raising efforts in 2021, has truly been inspirational" Matt said, "Due to all the shutdowns, we were forced to reduce fraternal event programing and concentrate our attention on fundraising, simply to maintain our beloved building and keep the lights on. Tripoli is our home, and those that stepped up to help should truly take pride in their efforts. Whether the contribution was large or small, it didn't matter; everyone contributed what they could when it was needed most, and all was appreciated."


Matt's spirit is high going into his new position as Potentate and is so looking forward to having a prosperous and engaging year in 2022.



Facing Challenges with Confidence Shriners Hospitals for Children empowers kids with craniofacial conditions

Craniofacial differences can be caused by a combination of genetic and/or environmental factors and are sometimes diagnosed before birth. Our physicians often meet with expectant parents to discuss our approach to cleft lip and/or palate repair and to help them know what to expect after delivery and in their baby's first few months.

Cleft repair at Shriners Hospitals for Children is done by experienced pediatric surgeons. Other members of a child's care team may include speech therapists, audiologists, dentists and dental radiologists, child life specialists and anesthesiologists.



Finding reassurance

Parents Carly and Max knew their son, Saint, would need cleft treatment even before he was born.

They were referred to Eric Liao, M.D., co-director of the Cleft and Craniofacial Center, a collaboration between Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston and Massachusetts General Hospital for Children. "We visited Dr. Liao before Saint's arrival," Carly said. "We left the appointment not only with an understanding of the anticipated course of action for repairing Saint's cleft, but also with a sense of reassurance that we were going to get through this."

Abraham, called "Abie" by his family, was also treated by Dr. Liao at the Boston Shriners Hospital. "As soon as we met the cleft team, we knew we had found the right people to take care of Abie," his mother, Marcy, said.

Marcy recalled underestimating how dramatic the outcome of Abie's surgery would be.

"I remember Dr. Liao assuring us that once the repair was made, it would look like it never happened," she said. "I didn't think it was possible at the time, but he was right."





A Team Effert

Terilyn, 8, is treated by a multidisciplinary team, including craniofacial plastic surgeon David Morris, M.D., at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Chicago.



Their approach helped put the little girl and her mother, April, at ease. "When your child is an infant, the surgeries are hard on you as a parent," April said. "But now she's older and she understands what's happening."

Repetition at a pre-op appointment helped Terilyn grasp what was coming. "One nice thing about Shriners Hospitals' approach is that everyone on the team had the same consistent story for Terilyn at that visit," said April. "Dr. Morris told her everything to expect and asked her if she had questions. Then the psychologist said some of the same information. Then the nurse practitioner talked to Terilyn about her surgery. As a mom, I can see that she's getting this in her head from that visit because they all shared the same story with her."

Six weeks later, after surgery, Terilyn was thrilled to get cleared to enjoy her favorite snack. "I'll go home and probably just have chips and more chips," she said.

Megan was born with a severe case of cleft lip and palate, as well as hemifacial dysplasia, a condition affecting the growth rate of the bones in her face. Her journey with the Portland Shriners Hospital began when she was 5. The child life team there recognized Megan's fears and worked closely to help her. The techniques they used empowered Megan, and the fear of hospitals she once had were replaced with confidence. "Shriners is a totally different hospital – in a good way," said Megan, now 30.


As for Megan, she remained a patient of the Portland Shriners Hospital for 16 years, and the care she received had a life-changing effect on her. She graduated from the health care system in 2012, having had 28 surgeries.

Megan has authored and illustrated three children's books, donating proceeds to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Portland.

Copies of these books hold a special place in the family resource library at the hospital, which is available for all patients and families to enjoy.

"It's a loving hospital," Megan said. "It's like a second home."

Growing up spending a lot of time in hospitals sparked Megan's career interest. "I had some really wonderful nurses at Shriners Hospitals, and that's what made me want to get into nursing," she said. Last year, Megan graduated from nursing school at Whatcom Community College in Washington. She began working as a nurse at a long-term care facility, with hopes of someday working at Shriners Hospitals.

The Shrine Hospital in Chicago is more or less back to business as usual. With the reopening of the hospital, the

telehealth appointments with lessened. Last month there were 49 telehealth visits compared with 1328 onsite out patient appointments. The average inpatient population (overnight stays) is 8.6 per day.

The doctors are seeing more complex spinal situations. Last month there were 92 spinal surgeries with an average surgery time of 3hours 36 minutes per surgery. This is a tribute to the ability of our doctors to be able to handle these more difficult cases.

Big positive is that The Chicago hospital has already

exceeded the goal for donations in 2021. by 22%. With December typically being the best month for donations, it is expected that they will finish the year on a very high note.

Another positive for Chicago is the net patient revenue (money collected from insurance Medicaid, Medicare etc) is showing increased income. What this means is that there will be less draw on the endowment fund that helps support the hospital.

In summary, the Chicago hospital is in great shape and continues to improve and streamline their operation in line with the Imperial Shrine Hospital board edicts. Larry Wegner

Easing the Pain

Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to reducing the use of opioids and providing new techniques for pain management.



Brothers Hayden and Hudson had the same surgery, but with very different pain management techniques.

Brothers Hayden, 19, and Hudson, 16, both had Nuss bar surgery at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Springfield, two years apart. Even though they had the same procedure, they had very different experiences. Hayden spent a week in the hospital recovering, while Hudson went home the next day. The difference was cryoablation.

Limiting the use of narcotics was important to the boys' mother, Amy. "We lost a relative to opioid addiction a few years ago, so this was really personal to us," she said. "We were over the moon to hear that Shriners Hospitals offered a way to reduce the use." After his surgery, Hayden felt nauseated and had no appetite due to the pain medications he needed. He spent the next few months mostly on the couch. Hudson, on the other hand, was walking around shortly after his surgery. "Within a few days, he was making his own breakfast," April recalled.
