

Submitting information for the Tattler Magazine.

- 1) **Text formatting:** Our software program only accepts raw text, no bold, no font size, no fancy font, no special margins, no centering, no bullets, and especially no cute pictures. If you need those items, they have to be re added after they are in our software program, which takes more time. Please be considerate that it won't look the same way as submitted.
- 2) **Word Processing:** Use Microsoft Word, or equivilant and please use the spelling and grammer editor.
- 3) Word count restrictions: Units, Clubs and Alliances are to be kept to less than 300 words.
- 4) **Flyers:** that need to be designed by me, should be requested ONE month prior to to your deadline. No exceptions! Please do not design a flyer in word. This has to be reformatted to a JPG or PNG and this produces a lesser quality image. Ideally they should be designed in program like Canva, which is a free and a fun way to design anything or similar program. All flyers must have a date, time, contact and location on it.
- 5) **The DEADLINE IS TO BE RESPECTED!** Most Shriner magazines and newsletters have a deadline of the 1st of the month. I am trying to accommodate everyone, but where other Shriners have teams, I am only one volunteer person who has multiple duties as the editor. 


