The Tripoli Scottish Highlanders are the official Pipes and Drums Band of Tripoli Shrine, and its only musical marching unit.

The Highlanders started life as a pipe band for a Canadian Legion post which was once located in West Allis. Those members, also being Shriners moved the band to Tripoli Temple. In 1975 the band became a chartered unit of Tripoli Shrine.

Our parade season starts with St. Patrick's Day and extends through the spring, summer and fall. In addition to marching parades, we perform at charity events and many other occasions. We host the Highlander Tartan Ball, which is a black-tie dinner where we enjoy, pipe bands, Celtic music, dancing and haggis. Many Shriners and non-Shriners attend and it's the highlight of the local social calendar.

Throughout the year we have unit member family picnics and social gatherings.

Do you need to be Scottish or Irish to play the pipes, or join the band? No, any member of Tripoli Shrine is welcome to join. Master Masons in good standing with their lodge and intending to join the Shrine are also welcome to join us.

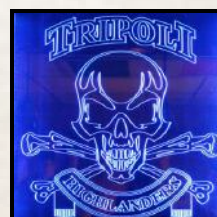
Do you need prior musical experience? Although musical experience is helpful, we had many members

# Know Your Noble

I came to meet Dale A Graeven when I was interviewed at Tripoli for my current position. He has been right by my side; teaching me the structure of the Divan, guiding me through my process and helping me to succeed in my endeavors. Most of the Shriners I have met, have told me about their separate unit and about other Shriners, men that have made this organization great, but little about themselves. That is an attribute that they all have, humility.

When I was photographing the Divan, they asked what I was going to do with them. I told Dale the same thing. When you write an article, your picture goes right beside it. Dale was the only one that said "yes, but could you do an interview instead" and here it is.

After Dale Graeven graduated from Milwaukee Trade and Technical High School in 1977, he then joined Damascus Lodge #290 and became a Mason in 1981. He and his father joined the Shriners in 1986, along with 85 other members. At that time, he was told that he could only join one unit, being the rule breaker that he was in the beginning, joined several starting with the Director's Staff. Hillbillies and Long Riders came second along with Circus chairman, and DeMolay.

When he was explaining the progressive line of the Divan, things started to make more sense. Elected and appointed was obvious but all the titles and their positions were unfamiliar to me, only having a Shriner in the

past 3 years. Each Shrine Temple has the minimum number of Divan members as set by Imperial by-laws at five. Each position in the line has its own title, from Arabic with each of its own defined duties and responsibilities. Noble Dale Graeven is the Assistant Rabban, under the Potentate and Chief Rabban and above the High Priest and Prophet and the Oriental Guide. You could say he is the middleman but that would be an understatement for what it has taken him to get here.

Each group he is a member of, each position he has accepted, each chair held and each board he has been on, is his personal perseverance for personal growth. His duties as Assistant Rabban include opening and closing of all ceremonies, being a Liaison to assigned units, Crusaders, DeMolay, an Imperial Representative, and the Investment and Budget Committees. In the meantime, he will attend Assistant Rabban school that the Imperial set up for success in that position.

Dale did skip Oriental Guide but I think he made it up with the experience he received being Chairman of the Circus, Past President of the Shrine Director's Association, President of the United Masonic Board of DeMolay in Wisconsin, Past Director of the Director's Staff, The Worshipful Master-Damascus, member of Silas Shepherd Lodge of Research and President of the Ahrens Foundation, to say a few, he has widened his knowledge base to benefit the Shrine.

Dale feels right now that the most important job that he has, is preparing for 2023, when he will hopefully be Potentate. He is already working on his budget, schedule, and fundraisers.

When he worked for Harley Davidson, he got his passion for riding but in his car, he loves to drive from coast to coast. In his downtime, he loves a great BBQ on his grill with his "fermented corn" in hand, playing board games and dreaming of the day he can find time to go on Kentucky Bourbon Trail. If you ask Dale his two best accomplishments in his life, it would be marrying Sondra in 1983 and the birth of his son, Paul, in 1997. Paul has followed his footsteps with the title of Past State Master Counselor of the Wisconsin DeMolay and also a member of the Damascus Lodge.

Dale is in Tripoli on most Thursdays when Sondra is volunteering in the office. Stop on in and he will tell you a joke.





# Bentley's Big Steps

Bentley was born prematurely at 29 1/2 weeks with quadriplegic cerebral palsy, a condition that affects movement in all four limbs of the body.

“Our doctors at that time basically gave us no hope,” his mother, Linda, said. “They thought Bentley would never be independent – he wouldn’t be able to talk ‘normally,’ walk or even feed himself.”

Bentley’s parents researched other health care options for their son, and Bentley became a patient of Shriners Healthcare for Children – Florida in 2013, where he has since had two surgeries. In addition, Shriners Healthcare provides Bentley with the equipment he needs to stay on the move: both a manual and a power

wheelchair, as well as a pair of ankle-foot orthoses each year to help support him while he grows. Bentley uses his newest devices, hip-knee-ankle-foot orthoses, to help stabilize his legs during physical therapy as he learns to walk.

Bentley took big steps – his first outside of his physical therapy appointments – at the University of South Florida’s Dance Marathon event in Tampa, Florida, earlier this year. After participating in the event the year before from his wheelchair in two full-leg casts, Bentley told his family he was determined to walk across the stage this year. In a packed ballroom of nearly 1,000 people, Bentley did just that. Onlookers cheered, wept and shouted for him as he took the stage alongside his mom for this monumental moment.

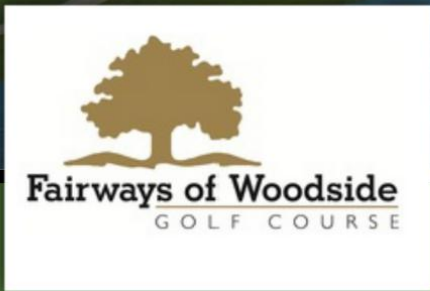

## Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh June 10, 1922 - April 9, 2021

On April 9th, we said our farewell to our Brother, HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, who laid his tools aside and passed to the Grand Lodge Above.

Dear Brother, may it be your portion to hear from the Judge Supreme: "Well done my good and faithful servant, enter now to your reward."

His Royal Highness, The Duke of Edinburgh started his life in Freemasonry in 1952, at the age of 31. He was initiated into Navy Lodge, No 2612 in the Metropolitan Grand Lodge of London, on the 5th of December.

On the 6th of March 1953, HRH Prince Philip progressed to the Second Degree of Freemasonry, before advancing to the Third Degree on the 4th May 1953. The United Grand Lodge of England (UGLE) issued his Grand Lodge Certificate on the 7th of May that same year and he has remained a member to this day.

Despite never advancing further than Master Mason he was a regular paid up member of the Lodge until his death.

Our sincere condolences to The Royal Family, the British nation and all who knew him.

# For Kids With Disabilities, The Fun Has Just Begun

From toys to bikes, there's a world of fun just waiting for kids with disabilities

Starlit, a patient of the Chicago Shriners Hospital, received her bike just in time for her seventh birthday. Starlit has cerebral palsy with weakness on her right side, which means she can't ride a typical off-the-shelf bicycle. Back in February, Starlit was staying in the hospital for intensive rehabilitation involving physical, occupational and recreational therapy. She attended a Project Mobility bike night at the hospital, where patients were able to try out bikes and be fitted for a bike in their size range and ability level. Starlit's mom, Stephanie, wrote a thank-you email to the hospital, sharing these thoughts:

Some Shriners Hospitals for Children locations offer adaptive bicycles and ride-on toys that give kids more than just mobility – they provide hours of fun. For example, Shriners Hospitals for Children – Chicago offers the Go Baby Go program, which provides adapted ride-on toy cars that use a switch instead of a pedal. They are custom-fit to allow the child to “drive” the vehicle.

Also, through a collaboration with the nonprofit organization Special Bikes for Special Kids, patients of the Chicago Shriners Hospital can apply for the specialized bikes, which are provided to the hospital by Project Mobility and are given to selected recipients at no charge. Since 2011, the Chicago Shriners Hospital has provided 71 adaptive bikes to patients.

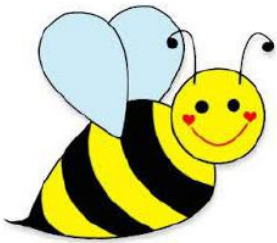
