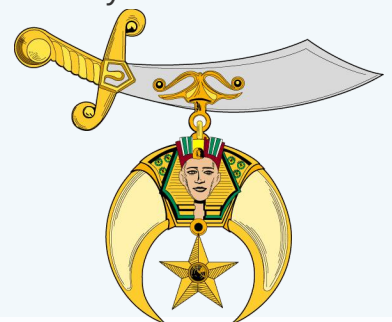

The SHC-TC staff continue to build upon the new model of care for all children needing pediatric orthopedic care. Despite the continuous spread of the Covid Delta variant, SHC-TC Orthopedic doctors, physician assistants, nurses, and prosthetic engineers held an "Outreach Clinic" in Bismarck, North Dakota. The outreach clinic exemplified the new mission of "Seeing more kids, in more places, with less draw on the endowment." The new mission is bringing the great care Shriners that provides to the kids, and the outreach clinic in Bismarck save a few families a nearly a seven-hour trip (one way) to the Twin Cities.

Since Covid continues to put a strain on all healthcare organizations, and the staff that provide the care, volunteers are needed more than ever....even the 4-legged and hairy kind. SHC-TC added three new canine volunteers (and owners) to the pet therapy program. They may work for free, but they never turn down a tasty treat.

Part of providing great care often requires taking a proactive approach, and SHC-TC is doing just that. Recently SHC-TC started a proactive approach to healthcare by offering "Sports Physical Program" with very favorable results. Almost 40 young athletes were screened with three receiving further scoliosis care, three receiving physical therapy and one receiving a nutrition referral. This campaign connected with over 10,000 FB touches to promote SC-TC. Due to the success of this program, SHC-TC will be



offering this program for winter and spring sports as well.

With the Sports Physical Program, children are screened before they start their busy sports season. For instance, the USA Patriots America's Amputee Softball Team Kids' Camp was held in Fond du Lac, WI. Ten up and coming athletes, who are also patients at SHC-TC, attended this weeklong camp to increase their love of sports, build and sharpen their skills, and create life-long friendships.

The staff at SHC-TC learn important lessons from the kids they care for every day. One important lesson is to work hard, but also play hard.

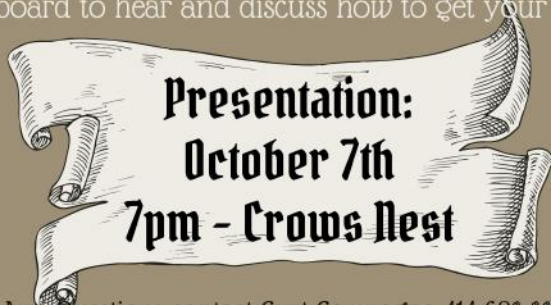

In addition to the Shrine temple that was damaged, several Lodges suffered catastrophic damage.

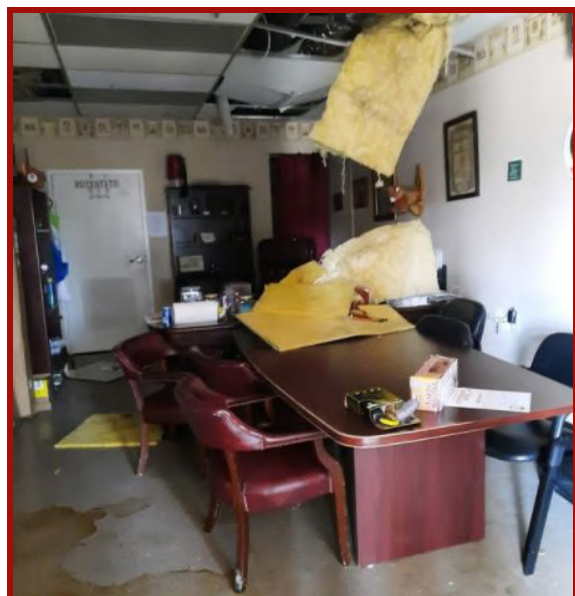

On a warm May spring day I sat down with my friend Cecil McGrew, the Director of Operations for the Levy Group at the Firerv Forum, after a softball game as we were enjoying a few beers. He was complaining about how he had a hard time getting people to work concessions at the Fiserv Forum.

The City of Milwaukee Health Dept. allowed Fiserv capacity to go from 25% to 100% capacity in about two weeks. He expressed how hard it would be to hire hundreds of employees in that short of time for the Milwaukee Bucks playoff run forthcoming. So I asked about a Not for Profit (NFP) program and he said the union had been against it in the past but they had no choice and may reinstate that program. I said, "if you did restart the NFP program I could get a bunch of Shriners to help out." Two hours after I got home that night he sent me the info and told me to fill out the contract and return it to him.

After conversations with Gerry Arnholt & Ill Sir Joe Brunk it was determined that we had nothing to lose with this opportunity. There was no monetary investment on Tripoli's part. We just needed volunteers to provide some effort and time. **On June 10th, the first night, we had 27 people volunteer and on July 20th, the last night we had 49 volunteers. A total of 97 people worked 379 shifts over the Bucks Playoff run.**

These volunteers helped to generate over \$865,000 in concession sales. We also were given all the tips that customers left when they made their purchases.

I am pleased to announce that last month, a donation from Levy was made to the Tripoli Shriners for **\$159,620.47**. This amount is higher than what I announced at the Stated Meeting because I didn't have the tip money amount and wanted to be sure before I gave a donation amount.

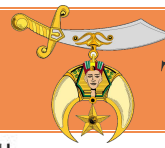

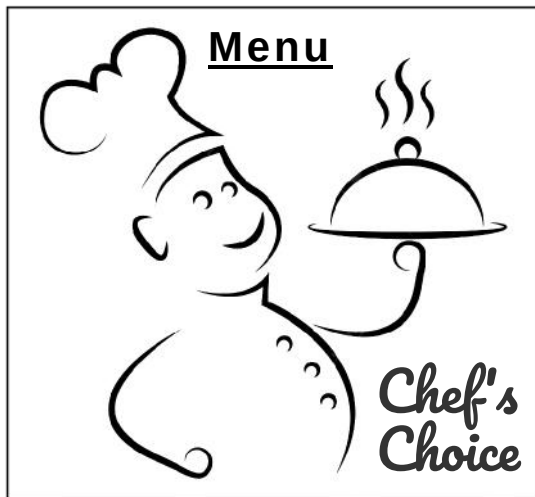
