Who is Jim Burton?

I was born in Milwaukee, WI on December 19, 1951, graduated from Wisconsin Lutheran High School in 1970. From the late 1960's into the early 1970's I worked in the food service from dishwasher to waiter at several restaurants, all at

the same time, including Tripoli Country Club. I went to UWM Milwaukee College. Using my artist talent from High School, I then worked in the Auto Body Trades for 3 years. That led to employment to the U.S. Postal Service as a Clerk in 1973 then for 27 years as a Letter Carrier then as a supervisor for 16 years for a total of 44 years of service. On July 9, 1977 I was married at Whitefish Bay Methodist Church, which sadly ended in divorce in 1988. We had two children, Alicia and Courtney. I have three wonderful grandchildren, Isabella, Noelle and Lincoln. Bella and Noelle were born three days apart, and I lovingly call them my "twin" granddaughters.

What do you like about Milwaukee and what keeps you here?

My roots are here, my family and friends, and Milwaukee is known for our work ethics and family-inclusive activities. My parents taught me the following work efficacy: if I would end up digging ditches, to dig the best ditch possible, do the best job you can imagine doing; so I decided to become a Mason to be the best man I could be.

Who was your Masonic Sponsor and why did you become a Master Mason?

Mainly family influence through my mother, June Burton, "Sweetheart the Clown", a Charter Member of "LAFT" (Laughter and Fun Technicians) a Clown Alley, knew Ed Heffner, "Simbo" and Al LaVesser, "Herbie", both Tripoli Clowns. I was introduced to Tripoli when she brought Clown groups to the Circus and Family Nite. "Herbie's" other persona was Santa Claus with my mother as Mrs. Claus. When "Herbie" became ill, I ended up picking up his Santa Suit. Thus began my career as Santa. That is when I saw Ed Heffner mentoring Al LaVesser with the

"Little Blue Cipher Book". As I held all in high regard, after his death in 2004, I decided I needed to replace him as a Mason, Santa, and Shriner.

My mom owned "Clowns Around Town", a clown service with magic shows. The Houdini Magic Club held their annual event at the Humphrey Scottish Rite building.

The Scottish Rite would hold the Feast of the Pascal lamb, and I was invited when Al LaVesser was emorialized. I was moved by their impressive ritual work. These magnificent building were additional factors that led me to Masonry.

What is your favorite part of being a Shriner?

To me, being a Shriner is part of a Brotherhood that has a common goal which is the support of each other with family activities which in turn supports our Temple and Shrine Hospitals for Children.

What Units and Clubs interested you and which ones are you currently involved in?

My plan was to visit different units to see what might be of interest to me. My initial thought was to become a bagpipe playing Highlander; however, I first visited the Long Riders. While at their meeting they "volunteered" me to host an event, over and above my "protest" that I wasn't even a member of the group. Their response was, "It doesn't matter, and do you see anyone else jumping up to do this?" Actually the bike intrigued me as back in the day I would do a lot of recumbent bike riding and have completed many Centuries (100 miles). Even though the decision was made for me to be a member of the long bike group and Commander for nine years, it has proved to be a lot of fun with a real sense of camaraderie. Speaking of camaraderie, I joined the Directors Staff from the get go; as they are the first face a Mason encounters to become a Noble. "AAONMS"

Why did you accept the current position of Oriental Guide?

In my first elected Divan position, I feel it is my duty to attend Oriental Guide School in Tampa to learn and be a part of a group that is here to make a difference.



What are you most excited to accomplish in that position?

To further the goals of our leadership and keep the tradition of Shrine Masons continuing in Milwaukee.

Where do you see Tripoli Shrine in five years?

We have a fantastic windfall opportunity for us "ALL" to help Tripoli become Financially Viable. "EVERY ONE OF US" needs to jump on board the "Fiserv Bandwagon".

We must realize what we have here at Tripoli and how quickly we can lose what our Founding Fathers have created for future generations making Our Shrine become the best Temple that we have the ability to become. We need to become Financially Astute, so that we can still be around to support the Hospital.

Shriners Children's - Twin Cities Report

Greetings everyone.

The final numbers for last year were released during the Board of Governor's meeting, and things are looking up for the entire hospital system. People were extremely generous with their donations in 2021 and the total amount of donations received at the Twin Cities location so far (some numbers are still being calculated) was approximately \$3.8 million dollars. That's a phenomenal achievement for the hospital and the system as a whole.

While donations are great, finding more kids to care for is still of the utmost importance, and last year the efforts to find more patients paid off dramatically with 709 total referrals to the Twin Cities location, which resulted in 210 more patients being accepted than 2020. While some nay-sayers may remind us that any numbers compared to 2020 could be considered trivial, since everything was closed down in 2020; the numbers from 2021 indicate operations are back to 2019 levels, and if take into account that 2021 started much like 2020 ended, the total numbers received from 2021 astounded every member of the Board because it exemplified and confirmed all the hard work, efforts, and dedication given by the hospital staff. They are unquestionably committed to our Shrine kids and the Shriners healthcare philosophy and are the embodiment of providing "The Best Care Anywhere"!

Flipping the coin and mentioning the areas that need improvement, the Shriners healthcare system does need some improvements, that frankly, we as Shriners should be aware of so that we because after all....it's our hospital system. As mentioned in last month's report, the U.S. healthcare system as a whole is adapting to the demands of the market. Inpatient visits are dropping, and outpatient visits are increasing, an average of 2% each year. With this change in care, the 'systems' of healthcare facilities also need to change, and Shriners Children's is not excluded. Metrics seem to measure everything these days, and if your system only provides inpatient metrics, it's difficult for our doctors and administrators to measure outpatient performance and quality. That's one of the current challenges facing our Shriners healthcare system. Thankfully, this topic was brought up last month during the Leadership Conference in Chicago, and most of our Administrators (the guys running our hospitals) believe the inpatient numbers they seek will be provided when Shriners Childrens transitions to the MyCare portal. This hit home for me, because I use the MyChart app for my personal healthcare, which is part of the MyCare system.

Areas that need improvement "locally" are referrals. Shriners make up only a small percentage of people who refer patients to our hospitals – and that's system wide, not only in the Twin Cities. The easiest thing you can do to help is...talk to people! If you know any school nurses, talk to them about the great care Shriners Children's provides. If you have friends in a rural or low-income community, talk to them about Shriners care. The biggest battle we continuously fight is people NOT knowing about our hospitals or the care Shriners Children's provides.

Like everything, the process of getting kids into our system has changed from what it was 20 or 30 years ago, but the outcome has not! If we can help a family not just the child, but the entire family - receive world renowned care, that should be the primary focus. If getting that care from Shriners reduces the risk of the family losing their home or becoming overburdened with financial stress, because the care they receive is free or Shriners will pay their huge insurance deductible, that should be considered the icing on the cake. True, it would be easier if we could still claim, "We provide free healthcare to children.", especially during this time when wants everything for free. Take into everyone consideration though, being able to make that claim changed more than a decade ago (2009). Now, if we remain focused on the care, instead of how it's being paid for, referring patients should still be an easy task. It's certainly important enough to stay vigilant.

Giant bell salvaged by Gaspar's Grotto rings up donations for Shriners!



The term "tip-jar bell" seems to denote delicate tinkling chimes, like an angel earning its wings in It's a Wonderful Life. But the peal of the hefty, 740 pound, cast-iron bell hanging behind the bar at Gaspar's Grotto in Ybor City, FL is something you feel in your fillings. Made in the 1880s, the former church bell occupies a place of pride behind the E Seventh Avenue bar. Add in its iron suspension and wheel, and you're talking half a ton of ding-dong.

The bell is rung by bar staff with a quick tug on the toller, a hammer that strikes the bell. Much more satisfying for patrons, however, is when they get to tug on a length of thick rope that tilts the 34-inch bell so it strikes the clapper.

The bar uses the lure of ringing the bell to raise funds for Eric Schiller's favorite charity, the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Patrons can earn the right to sound the bell if they make a donation to the hospital. The donations are collected in a fez.

The bell was built in a Cincinnati foundry for a south central Indiana church. There it summoned worshipers to Sunday services for almost 70 years before the church was demolished. It was purchased in the 1960s by a farmer in Spencer, In. He left it outside a barn where it lay until 2015, when Schiller purchased it for \$500. It needed a lot of love and care to get it back to working order. The owner of the bar, Eric Schiller looked far and wide to find missing parts. Those he couldn't find had to be made, including a new clapper that was cast by a Tennessee foundry. The bell had to be sandblasted and powder-coated to restore its bronze-like finish.

Fiserv Forum 2021 Recap

Well, I fell into a huge fundraiser for Tripoli while drinking a beer last summer. During the Bucks Playoff Series, we had 88 volunteers from June 10 – July 20, 2021, people step-up the help us and many were nonmembers. Over these 12 dates last summer we received a check for \$159,620.47 for our fundraising volunteerism. This has been an enormous boost to the financial stability of Tripoli Shrine.

Since August 10th, Tripoli Shrine has continued to provide volunteers for Levy Foodservice selling concessions at the Fiserv Forum. By the end of the year, we had 27 more dates that we volunteered. We received checks for 20 of those dates totaling \$40,256.58 with 139 shifts worked. That is an average of \$289.62 per person. Since 1/1/2022 we have had 7 dates and we can expect about an additional \$15,182.15 to come to Tripoli Shrine. As you can see this is a great money maker and that is why we have kept this going.

In the future, we are commitment to provide a minimum of 7 volunteers per Milwaukee Bucks home game. We meet at Tripoli 3 hours before the Tip-off of the game, so the shift is about 5 ½ hours. You will be on your feet most of the night. We work two pizza booths selling pizza, soda, and beer. We enter the order and hand them the food. That's it. It is extremely easy. The more we sell the more money we make. Please look for the ads in the Tattler for the dates help is needed.

To the right is a list of volunteers, with the number of shifts worked, who put in their time from August through the end of the year. Once again THANK YOU to everyone who helped with this awesome opportunity. While it is a lot of work, none of this could have happened if you didn't Believe.
