Being born in NovoCherkassk, Russia, her birth parents could not provide her with the care she needed, and literally abandoned her at an orphanage. Elena stayed in the orphanage until she 3 years old, which is when she was adopted by a loving family from Minnetonka, Minnesota. A family friend suggested that Elena be taken to the Shrine Hospital in Minneapolis after Elena's adopted family was repeatedly told by other hospitals in the area that nothing could be done to help the child.

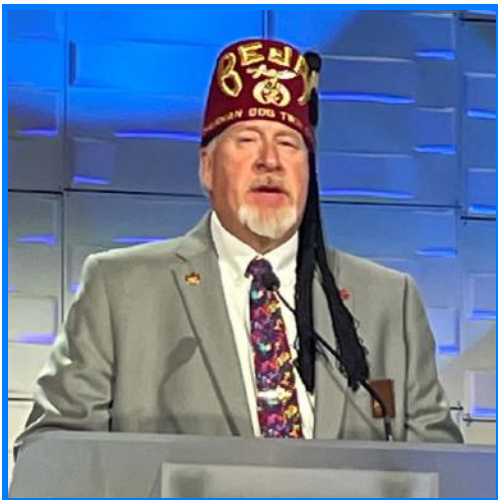


Elena had to lose her feet and part of her legs, right around the shin area, but was fitted with prosthetic legs, which enabled her to play her favorite sport – hockey, and live a fulfilling life. Elena is now a college graduate, works for a software development firm, and in her spare time, works with kids who face the same challenges she has and also love playing hockey. Patient Highlight – Eloise Cole

Eloise is a girl with a special spine: one that curved 37 degrees. This curvature was measured when Eloise was in sixth grade, but her doctor at the time did not prescribe her a brace, because they assumed she was done growing. The specialists they consulted also believed that the curve in her back would not get worse.

Eloise was a student that enjoyed many extracurricular activities, such as modeling and playing volleyball for her middle school team. Soon the family realized Eloise was not finished growing. She grew 8 more inches by eighth grade. By the time she was a freshman, her back was a serious issue. “I started to have pain. I couldn’t stand up for long periods of time. When I’d get home from school I’d lay down for a nap,” Eloise said. A specialist said she needed surgery immediately to correct a spine curve of more than 55 degrees.

Eloise’s mother, Kim, searched for the right place to find treatment. Her boss told her about the world-class care provided at Shriners Hospital for Children Chicago. The family saw Michal Szczodry, MD, a pediatric spine surgeon who specializes in scoliosis and spinal deformities. Dr. Szczodry performed a spinal fusion on the 14 year old. “Even though (surgery) was a long 12-hour day we knew she was in good hands,” Kim said.

A year later, Eloise was back in the game, modeling and even playing competitive volleyball again. Recently, Eloise graced the runway at the Annual Medinah Ladies Fashion Show. She is now healthy and able to pursue her interests and many dreams, thanks to the care she received at Shriners Hospitals for Children Chicago. This fall, she will attend the University of South Florida, majoring in environmental science.

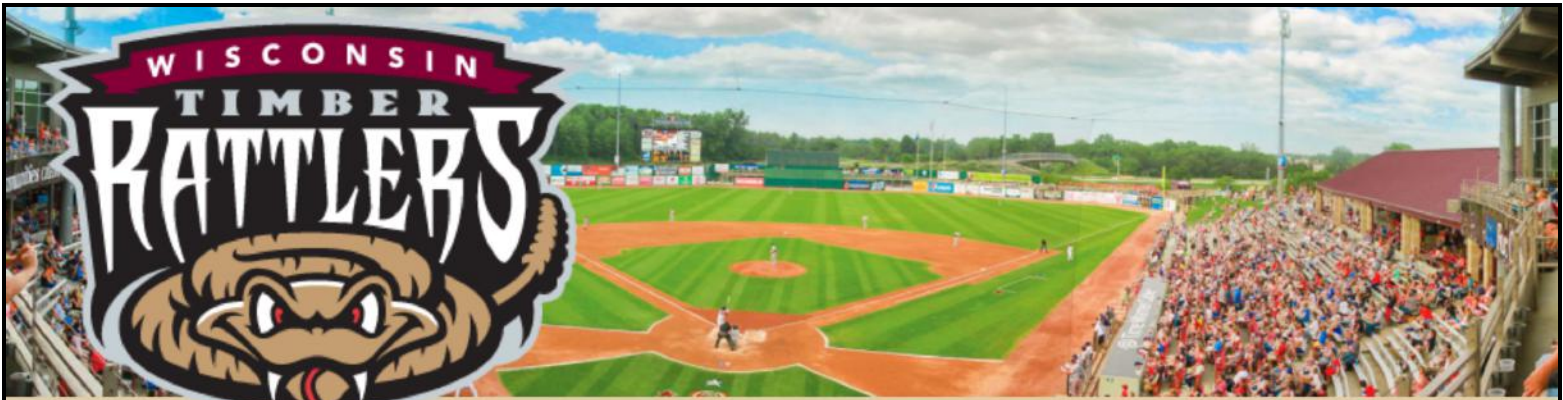

From the Tripoli Shriners

From its Earliest Days the Shriners Were Known for Their Philanthropic Efforts Across the Country.

During a yellow fever epidemic in Jacksonville, Florida, members of the new Morocco Shrine and Masonic Knights Templar worked long hours to help the sick. In 1889 Shriners came to the aid of the Johnstown, Pennsylvania, flood victims. In fact, by 1898 there were 50,000 Shriners, and 71 of the 79 temples were engaged in some sort of philanthropic work.

By the early 1900s the fraternity was growing quickly. And as the fraternity was growing, so was the support for establishing an official charity. Most temples had local philanthropies, and sometimes the Shriners' organization offered aid. After the 1906 San Francisco earthquake Shriners sent \$25,000 to help the fallen city. Shriners contributed \$10,000 for the relief of European war victims. But neither of these efforts, nor the projects of individual temples, satisfied the membership.

The idea to establish hospitals for children was brought to the membership in 1919 by

Freeland Kendrick (P.I.P., Lu Lu Shriners, Philadelphia) after he visited a Scottish Rite Hospital for Crippled Children in Atlanta. This visit made Kendrick aware of the overwhelming need to care for children with orthopaedic disorders.

During his tenure as Imperial Potentate in 1919 and 1920, Kendrick traveled more than 150,000 miles, visiting a majority of the 146 Shrine temples and campaigning for an official philanthropy to be established.

U.S. President Warren Harding, and member of Aladdin Shriners attends the 1923 Imperial Session

U.S. President Warren Harding was the first President to become a Shriner. He belonged to Aladdin Shriners in Grove City, Ohio.

President Harding attended the 49th Imperial Session in 1923 in Washington, D.C. He and his wife, First Lady Florence Harding, watched the parade from the viewing stand. After a several hours long parade, he addressed the crowd at the Public Opening.

Harding said, "I think I know the very soul of Masonry, out of which the Shrine has come to lighten our burdens and add cheer to our daily lives."

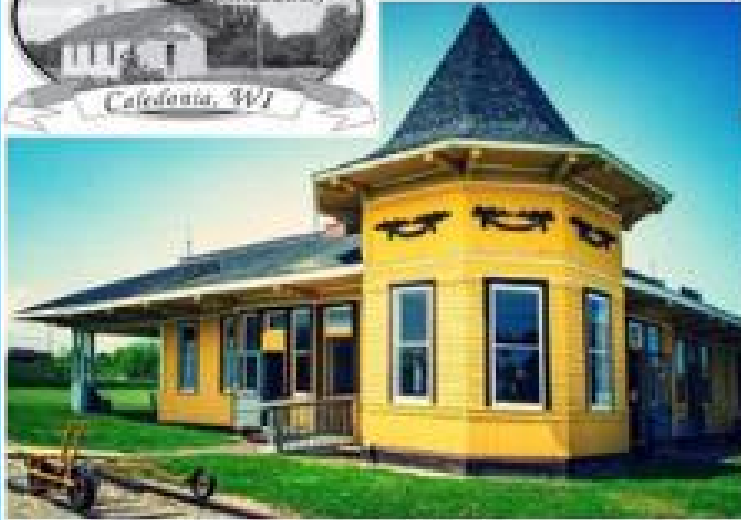

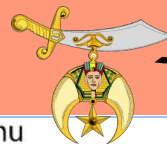


