Shriners Children's Twin Cities

The first quarter for the Twin Cities hospital has been good. Foundationally, traction has been gained in regards to how the ambulatory care clinic model is expected to operate. There's a constant need for discussions to be had with other organizations regarding increased collaborative efforts. Ultimately, the hope is these collaborative efforts will ensure Shriners Children's will be able to care for more children in more places, which aligns with Vision 2035; equally important, there's also a constant need for the hospital to maintain its presence within the Twin Cities market and within the very large catchment area the hospital is responsible for. Along with creating new partnerships, as well as strengthening established partnerships, collaborative efforts also includes getting back to a regular schedule for the outreach clinics at several locations throughout the midwest.

Operationally, the hospital is still burdened with outdated bylaws that need to change in order to remain relevant and true to the mission of serving all children, with the best care anywhere, regardless of the means to pay. Unfortunately, the stigma that Shriners only serves "free kids" is still quite prevalent among other healthcare organizations.

This means that children are not being recommended or referred to the hospital because it is believed Shriners may not be included in the family's insurance network of preferred providers. Much work is still needed to educate everyone that the beauty of the Shriners system is that we can serve all who can and want to pay, as well as all who cannot pay. Shrine Children's the differentiator that addresses health care disparity among children.

Clinically, services that had dwindled over the past several years due to market dynamics, are starting to be added back. To give an example, cranial facial services have been added to address conditions such as plagiocephaly - the flat spot that can develop on the back of a baby's head if they stay on their backs too long. Added to the list of additional services offered is surgical care for cleft lip and palate, sensory stimulation space therapy equipment, and direct community referrals for therapy (this is huge).

Finally, the past two years have been extremely challenging with COVID and the various aspects of wearing masks, distancing and vaccinations. The good news is as mask mandates lighten and decrease, the hospital staff has shown exceptional resilience as they have "weathered the worst of the storm" for now, and are beginning to feel they can accomplish anything as a team. Every Shriner should be extremely proud of the team working at Shriners Children's Twin Cities.

SCI Study Stats



Shriners Children's Research Demonstrates Long-term Impacts of SCI

- 1995** year study began
- 500+** former patients enrolled
- 59** age of oldest participant
- 2,700** participant interviews conducted

PATIENTS IN THE STUDY

- 53%** have tetraplegia (paralysis of both the upper and lower body)
- 66%** drive independently (using adaptive equipment)
- 42%** have a bachelor's degree or higher
- 15%** have a master's degree or higher
- 46%** are employed
- 68%** live independently
- 48%** are in a romantic relationship

In addition to providing care for children with spinal cord injuries, Shriners Children's conducts research to understand the longterm impact of these injuries and ultimately offer even better treatments, insight and assistance.

Shriners Children's Chicago has managed a spinal cord injury research study for nearly a quarter-century. Long-term outcomes and life satisfaction of Individuals with Pediatric-onset Spinal Cord Injury began in the '90s, led by **medical director emeritus of SCI at Shriners Children's Chicago, Lawrence C. Vogel, M.D.**

“There is no comparable study that has followed such a large population of individuals with pediatric-onset SCI longitudinally into adulthood,”

Participants include former patients ages 19 and older who sustained a spinal cord injury as a child and received SCI rehabilitative care at one of three Shriners Children's SCI programs, which are Lawrence C. Vogel, M.D. located at our hospitals in Chicago, Philadelphia and Sacramento, California.

To date, over 520 current and former Shriners Children's patients have participated. Seventy-five of them were injured more than 30 years ago. Kathy Zebracki, Ph.D., took over as principal investigator 10 years ago. “There is no comparable study that has followed such a large population of individuals with pediatric-onset SCI longitudinally into adulthood,” said Zebracki. “Knowledge of psychosocial outcomes, such as attainment of employment, is critical to developing targeted state-of-the-art interventions addressing the current needs of aging adults living with SCI, as well as creating effective evidence-based rehabilitation and educational/prevention programs for those newly injured.” Zebracki said participants also keep in touch with researchers, sharing important milestones like job promotions, getting married, having children and even winning Paralympic gold medals.

What are the units that you belong to?

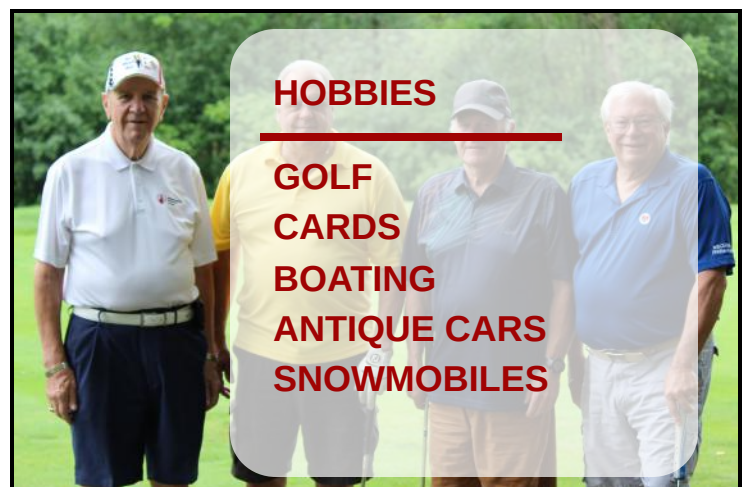



Despite the frequency of its occurrence and its severity, comprehensive care for patients with cleft lip and palate can be difficult to obtain. Shriners Children's is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a coordinated program of clinical excellence, teaching and research.

Groundbreaking research and discoveries

Shriners Children's strives to discover answers that will one day improve lives by conducting innovative research. **The Shriners Children's Genomics Institute is working to discover genetic causes for the conditions we treat and to develop new therapies.** Our researchers have made significant breakthroughs, improving the care and quality of life for countless children worldwide while adding to the global body of medical knowledge. Educating health care professionals We are also proud of our role in medical education. By maintaining relationships with several medical teaching facilities, Shriners Children's fosters an academic environment committed to providing superior education for medical professionals and quality care to all patients.
