Happy Thanksgiving to all, and safe travels while visiting your friends and family.

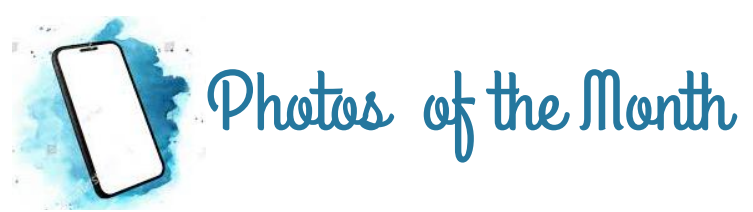
The last quarter has been quite busy with the Imperial Session in town, giving an opportunity to showcase the treatment rooms, the EOS treatment room, the new

X-ray space, and the therapeutic climbing wall. Approval was finally gained for community direct referrals in Therapy. This is a significant step forward in advancing the operations of Shriner Children's – Twin Cities by providing care to more children. Everyone looks forward to adding direct referrals with POPS and Imaging as well.

While the executive team continues to work hard on developing a broader Midwest market of shared resources, locally the executive team continues to focus on bringing new staff into support roles, recruiting new providers for the Unity Point/Blank Children's location in Des Moines, Iowa and a hiring a new medical director for the Twin Cities location. For the remainder of this year, efforts continue to build our distributive model of care with more affiliate partnerships in NE, SD, MN and WI, aligning with Vision 2035 of being able to see more kids in more places. Operational planning for 2023 is also in its final swing with a 2023 Strategic Plan completed and a Budget that will go forward for approval by the Joint Boards in November.

Administrator David Voller, the entire Shriner Children's – Twin Cities team, and the SC-TC Board of Governors extend a sincere and heartfelt 'Thank you for all the continued support given and they wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

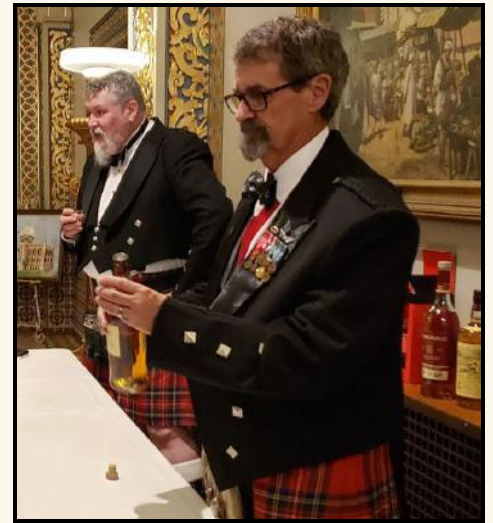

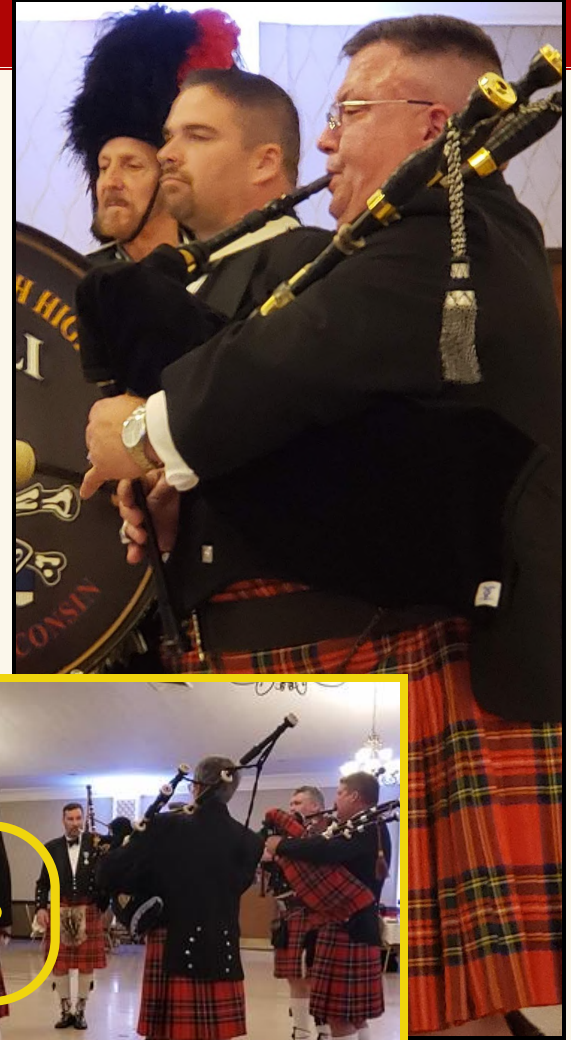

Tom Kim - Winner of the Shriners Children's Open PGA Tour

It's certainly easy to get carried away amongst the bright lights of Vegas, but comparisons to Tiger Woods have begun after the 20-year-old Korean sensation claimed his second PGA TOUR title in his last four starts.



Kim survived a knock 'em down, drag 'em out prize fight against former FedExCup champion Patrick Cantlay at the Shriners Children's Open when the American pulled his 72nd-hole drive into the desert and was unable to extricate himself expeditiously.

The pair were tied at the time, but Cantlay's triple-bogey finish allowed Kim to waltz down the final fairway with the smile of a winner. And what an infectious smile it is. It was just his 18th career start on TOUR.

In adding to his Wyndham Championship victory in August, Kim became the first player since Woods to win twice before turning 21. Woods coincidentally won his first of 82 TOUR wins in Las Vegas back in 1996.





Isaac Berger

Shriners National Patient Ambassador

Isaac is a 17 years old, high school senior who skis, plays hockey, snowboards, and hunts deer and wild turkeys. He mows the lawn, uses the weed-eater and operates the snowblower during the harsh Wisconsin winters.

And Isaac plays golf. Very well, in fact. He plays on his high school team and can beat his brothers.

And at the Shriners Children's Open this week he'll be hitting a shot at the par-3 eighth hole at TPC Summerlin with every team during Wednesday's pro-am.

The teenager expects to be nervous, but he knows how important his participation is to get the word out about Shriners, where he's received treatment and support since before he could walk.

"It's really exciting just because the fans will get to see how Shriners has helped people," Isaac says. "But it's also nerve-wracking just because all the people will be watching to see how they've helped people do things that people with two hands can."

Isaac is one of 22 patient ambassadors from across the country representing the health care network at the tournament this week. Shriners Children's provides care for orthopedic issues, as well as burn injuries, craniofacial conditions, spinal conditions and spinal cord injuries and colorectal and gastrointestinal problems – regardless of a family's ability to pay.

Eager to soak up all the knowledge he can from PGA TOUR pros, Isaac will also work as a standard bearer this week, and will walk inside the ropes with Wyndham Clark, who donated \$25,000 of his winnings from last year's RSM Birdies Fore Love competition at The RSM Classic to Shriners Hospitals. (Birdies Fore Love returns for the first nine events of the 2022-23 season.)



"They've really helped me grow as a person," Isaac says of Shriners. "I used to not be very confident about my arm and how it looked. But I've been a part of their family for so long ... it's who I am, and I can show it off."

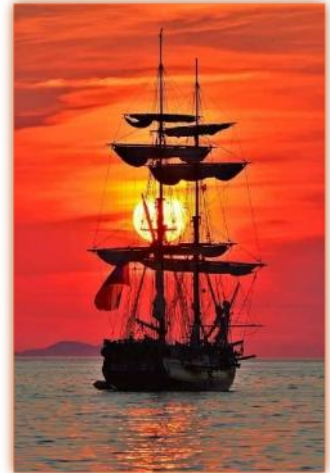

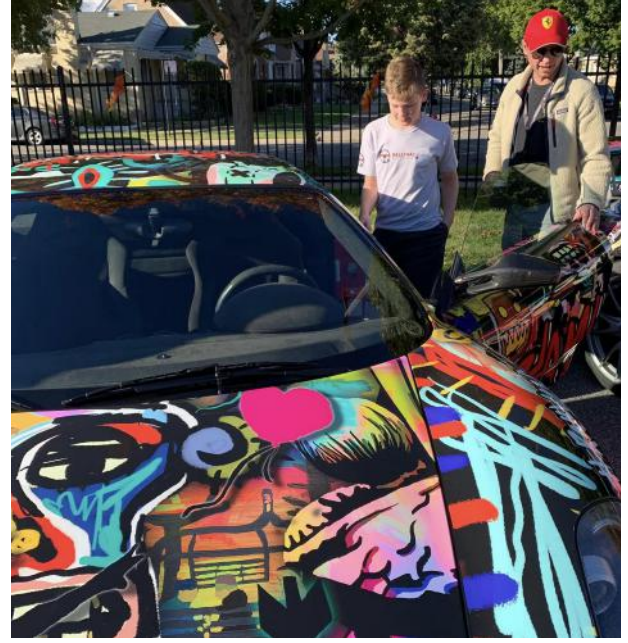

ATTENTION ALL NOBLES
Stated Meeting & Election of 2023 Officers
Wednesday, December 14, 2022

325.11 Election Regulations

(a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish, and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his education background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email, or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) Notice At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Please be sure to have your current dues card (2022) for the December meeting as only current, up to date members may vote. Your cards will be scanned to verify your status when you enter the temple.
