





A Story Written in the Stars




Kechi, a 2017 finalist on America's Got Talent, details her incredible story of survival, recovery and journey to becoming an inspiration to all in her memoir, More Than My Scars. Her book is the latest in a list of impressive accomplishments Kechi has achieved since nearly losing her life in a plane crash at 16.

One of only two survivors of the Sosoliso Airlines Flight 1145 crash in December 2005, which claimed the lives of 107, Kechi sustained third-degree burns on nearly 65% of her body. She was initially treated at a hospital in South Africa but eventually came to America, where she sought help at Shriners Children's Texas.



There, Kechi underwent more than 100 reconstructive surgeries and extensive physical therapy.

"Shriners gave me my life back," Kechi recently told a morning talk show based in her hometown. "I view South Africa where they brought me back to life, and Shriners Children's gave me my independence," she said. "They gave me everything that meant something."




During her recovery at Shriners Children's, Kechi became involved with the hospital's music therapy program, where she found the confidence to compete and become a finalist on America's Got Talent.



Kechi is now a recording artist, author and burn survivor advocate, raising awareness for global causes like youth empowerment and bullying prevention. Her involvement in various international organizations, along with her book, have given her a platform to share her story and inspirational message of hope and healing.



Without surgery she would have to have them amputated. She had six surgeries to save her legs. Shriners Children's therapists focused on mobility, endurance, strength and range of motion to get her back playing Soccer.

Back on the court

Parker was 10 when his life changed forever. In the car on the way to school, Parker's mom, Sharonda, had a seizure and lost consciousness. "Parker unbuckled his seat belt and got to the front to take over the wheel," Sharonda said. Her son's courageous action helped steer them away from oncoming traffic before crashing. "He saved our lives."

Parker was severely injured in the crash, with damage to his internal organs that required him to be put on life support for a time. Among his other serious injuries,

Parker suffered a badly broken ankle. When he learned that his leg would need to be amputated due to the injury, the athletic youth was devastated. Three months later, Parker became a patient of Shriners Children's Greenville, where a skilled team began working to help Parker get back to participating in the activities he loves.

Kaysie Li discovered a passion for service animal work during her care journey at Shriners Children's. Volunteers would visit her bedside with service dogs when she recovered from surgeries. Kaysie Li now trains service dogs of her own in hopes of supporting other pediatric patients someday.

From the Editor's Desk

I Wish I knew!

I have never posted anything personal before, but with the 100th anniversary of Shriners Children's which was on September 16th of this year, the more I find out about the Shriners and Shriners Children's, I find myself saying, "I wish I knew." The contents of this edition of the Tattler has been filled with stories of how 1.5 billion children were treated over one hundred years.

I wish my parents knew about Shriners Children's when I contracted Polio in the year 1954, after receiving the Saulk vaccine. I was 11 months old with a 106 fever for a week and almost died of complications. Through my perseverance, I pulled through with no long-term conditions. I wish they knew.

Now it is a different story when your own child is suffering. I see all these courageous children in these stories and feel for them, but I am especially heartbroken for their parents. In 1982 my son, DJ Bluma, was born with a muscular condition that primarily affects his skeletal and cardiac muscles with contractures. He was misdiagnosed several times throughout the years and still does not have a definitive diagnosis. He had a life expectancy of two years, then seven, and the last was fourteen years and he is still here enjoying life.

We went from New York to California to see doctors. First Cerebral Palsy, then Spinal Muscular Atrophy, then Emery Dreifuss Muscular Dystrophy and with all these doctors and tests never coming close to giving us relief. Why did no one tell us about Shriner Children's? Could we have gotten off the roller coaster ride?

DJ is 40 years old and quite independent, thanks to numerous splints and physical therapy dominating his life. Currently, he is no longer looking, just living! He uses a wheelchair and his lung capacity is under fifteen percent, but that does not stop him. He has not only inherited my drive and persistence but an extreme talent for ingenuity to conquer any obstacle he faces.

It is quite surreal that he is a Tripoli Shriner now and devotes his time to the organization through his skills in IT. I know what these parents are going through and if DJ could have been helped by Shriners Children's, who knows? We really would have loved the "family" that is talked so much about. I do, however, shout from the rooftops about this healthcare system to help anyone with a need.

Please enjoy this issue with such amazing stories of Shriners Children's patients and their families. They have been through so much and are in a wonderful healthcare system. 100 years of exeptional care.




