



Know Your Floble Mike Hendren

Mike and his Lady Evonne live in Waukesha. They were married in 1986 and have two children. Their daughter lives in Durham, NC where she works for a major university in the area. Their son is married and has 3 children and lives just outside of Dallas, TX where he works in the medical profession.

Mike was born in Pontiac, MI in 1954 and spent the first 16 years of his life there. Mike said, "It was a great area to grow up, but in 1970 my father was promoted and we moved to Buffalo, NY. We lived in Buffalo for a few years and then my father's work brought him and the family to Wisconsin, where I have been ever since." While in Buffalo he began working а Standardbred on racehorse farm and when he moved to Wisconsin, he found work in that profession again. He continued to train racehorses for about 5 years, working at several race tracks around the country. In 1977 he retired from that job and started in the air freight



transportation industry where he worked for over 40 years, retiring in 2020.

He joined West Allis Lodge #291 in April of 1989, Passed in June and Raised in October of 1989. He has also served as a Trustee for 3 years from 2011 thru 2013. He was a member of Scottish Rite class of 1990 and joined Tripoli Shrine in the winter ceremonial of 1990. "I have several uncles and cousins who are Shriners as well." said Mike. "I <mark>beca</mark>me a Mason & a Shriner of father". because my continued, "My Father was born in 1931 in Harrisburg, Ill, a town about 40 miles east of Carbondale, III. In October of 1936, at the age of 5, my father contracted polio. At that time, they called it "infantile paralysis" as they knew very little about the disease. The local Town Supervisor came out to the family farm and quarantined the farm for 2 weeks, thinking that the disease was contagious. My father's family was very lucky however as there was a Shriner from Ainad Temple in East St. Louis that lived in town and he was able to get my father into the Shriners Children's Hospital in St. Louis starting in the fall of 1936. For the next 14 years my father made many trips, transported by Shriner drivers, to the hospital and had over a dozen surgeries to minimize the effects of his polio. While at the Shriners Hospital they taught him how to walk, although with a distinct limp, and they taught him how to function and thrive to become a productive member of society."



Mike continued, "After High School I went onto college, where he met my mother and graduated with business degree. During my successful 40-year career in the transportation industry, Mom and Dad also had 3 children, of which I am the oldest. As a child, growing up, I heard all the stories of how the Shriners helped my father and his family. I thought someday I must find a way to try and repay that debt to the Shriners for helping my father physically and emotionally, instilling in him the confidence to overcome the effects of polio and become a successful family man and businessman. This is why I became a Shriner."

Mike is a member of Motor Corp, where this year he is serving the final year of his two-year term as Commander. It is a great unit that brings a lot of visibility to Tripoli and all Shriners, and serves as a reminder to the public of the work Shriners do for the kids. He is also in the Transportation Unit as well and, along with other drivers, transport patients to the Shriners Hospital in Chicago. This is a great way to be an ambassador for the Shriners.

SHRINERS CHILDREN'S CHICAGO EARNS **AORN** Go Clear Award™

Congratulations to our surgical services team for being officially recognized as a Center of Excellence in Surgical Safety: Smoke Evacuation by the Association of periOperative Registered Nurses (AORN).

Surgical smoke is caused when energy generating devices are used to stop bleeding or cut tissue in the operating room. Experts caution it may contain hazardous chemicals.

"About 95% of our procedures produce smoke. Anything that we use the electrical cautery device for to stop bleeding will cause smoke plume when you cauterize the wound," said Angela Carey, director of surgical services. Carey said improving safety and obtaining the award was a multistep process that involved a four-month audit, continuing education for all OR staff, and obtaining four smoke evacuators for the operating rooms. Receiving this national award represents the entire team's commitment to patient and staff safety, adoption of new practices and technology, and completion of team-based education. Congratulations!

Shriners Children's Becomes Largest Pediatric Motion Analysis Center in the World

For more than 40 years, Shriners Children's has been utilizing motion analysis technology, similar to what you might find in a Hollywood movie, in each of its 14 state-of-the-art Motion Analysis Centers (MACs). Motion analysis helps physicians determine the best treatment methods for children with movement differences caused by conditions such as cerebral palsy, scoliosis, brachial plexus or sports injuries. Now, the nonprofit healthcare system is making a change that it hopes will lead to even better patient outcomes and research advances.

"This is the type of change that will eventually open the doors for more innovative research and discoveries."

Shriners Children's is digitally integrating all 14 of its motion analysis labs across the country, making it the largest unified pediatric motion analysis center in the world. To help unify this change, Shriners Children's published a paper on its new Shriners Children's Gait Model (SCGM) this year in the Journal of Gait and Posture, which creates a standardized model to compare and interpret data across all facilities. Shriners Children's Vice President of Research Programs Dr. Marc Lalande said the revolutionary change will make it easier for doctors across their entire healthcare system to share data, learn from past patient experiences, inform future care decisions and perform cuttingedge research.

"This is truly a groundbreaking advancement for Shriners research and discoveries. It will truly improve the Children's because it means that patients, doctors, physical lives of our patients so we're very excited about therapists, engineers and other Shriners Children's staff can now what's in store."

analyze thousands of new data points and previous pediatric cases to make the most informed decisions on how they treat children, regardless of which hospital they were treated at," said Dr. Lalande. "While that may have been possible before, it was a more cumbersome process and we didn't have a unified, overarching system for how we process all of that data and qualify it. This is the type of change that will eventually open the doors for more innovative continued on next page



Motion analysis is a technology that uses data to help analyze how a child walks and moves. Shriners Children's uses high-speed cameras, reflective markers, force platforms and muscle sensors to record a child's movement patterns. The data is then analyzed using computer-generated imagery (CGI) similar to what you might see in a video game, to model the child's gait and allow doctors to compare it to a patient without a gait difference. Shriners Children's Corporate Director of Motion Analysis Centers Dr. Ross Chafetz said the technology allows doctors to pinpoint exactly where the problem is and more accurately determine the best course of treatment.

"With our new integrated system, when a patient comes in needing knee surgery, the doctor will be able to access data from all 14 MAC labs across our system, look at similar cases, and gain knowledge about what treatment option might be best for that child," Dr. Chafetz said. "The MACs also allow us to tell patients the surgeries we would recommend, and equally as important, when we wouldn't recommend surgery at all. Sometimes the data tells us

the patient just needs time to grow, and it's not as bad as we thought. Motion labs are a service many healthcare systems aren't able to offer because it can be a timely and cost-prohibitive process, but Shriners Children's has been a leader in this area for a long time, so we felt like this was an important step forward in how we continue delivering the most innovative care."

Dr. Chafetz said, as this technology continues to improve, we envision a future where developments in its MACs can be spread to all corners of the world, helping millions of children in different countries. Using artificial intelligence, Shriners Children's is actively leading research on the use of cell phone cameras to evaluate movement in children with disabilities. This allows us to remotely evaluate children, providing them access to a powerful tool that otherwise would not be available.

Dr. Vedant Kulkarni, Shriners Children's Northern California Orthopedic Surgeon and Assistant Chief of Orthopedics, said he considers the data provided by motion analysis to be a crucial part of his care plan for children.

Seventh Annual State of Science Conference bridges research, engineering, technology and healthcare.

The annual research conference developed by Shriners Chicago returned to our hospital February 28 - March 1. The Ballreich Patient Activity Mall hosted more than 130 physicians, clinicians, data scientists, engineers and researchers.

More than 30 presentations covered topics in muscle and bone health, including early research into a compound that could lead to the first oral treatment for OI. Some other talks included comparing pain control measures and several surgical techniques in orthopedics, and the fascinating muscle response in children missing parts of their arms, that scientists may one day use to develop even better prosthetics.

There were several Chicago staff presenters. For instance, Dr. Altiok presented on his early work in partnership with Georgia Tech, to use AI to provide earlier identification of Legg Calve Perthes disease.

Three members of the board of trustees for Shriners Children's, who are also members of the research committee, attended the two day conference. Congratulations to Sahar Hassani, administrative director of research and medical staff, and Dr. Gupta, our chief of staff, on a successful event.
